

**SUBSTITUTE FOR
SENATE BILL NO. 252**

A bill to make supplemental appropriations for the department of natural resources for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1998; to provide for the acquisition of land; to provide for the development of public recreation facilities; to provide for the powers and duties of certain state agencies and officials; to make supplemental appropriations for the capital outlay and for the department of military and veterans affairs for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1997; and to provide for the expenditure of appropriations.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 101. There is appropriated for the development of natural
2 resources to supplement former appropriations for the fiscal year ending
3 September 30, 1998, from the following fund:

7 DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES

8 Sec. 301. The department of natural resources shall enter into
9 agreements with local units of government for the purpose of administer-
10 ing the grants identified in section 101. Among other provisions, the
11 agreements shall require that grant recipients agree to dedicate to
12 public recreation uses in perpetuity the land acquired; to replace lands
13 converted or lost to other than public recreation use; and to convey to
14 the state any mineral interests acquired by the grant recipient with an
15 exception allowed for a share of the mineral interests acquired, which
16 share is based on the portion of the fair market value of the property
17 that was provided by the local cash contribution of the grant recipient.
18 The agreement shall also provide the full payments of grants be made only
19 after proof of acquisition is submitted by the grant recipient and all
20 costs are verified by the department of natural resources.

21 Sec. 302. The department of natural resources shall take steps nec-
22 essary to make available federal or other funds that may become available
23 for the purpose for which appropriations are made in section 101, and to
24 use any or all of the appropriations to meet matching requirements which
25 are determined to be in the best interest of the state.

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1 Sec. 303. Any unobligated balance in any appropriation made under
2 section 101 shall not revert to the fund from which appropriated at the
3 close of the fiscal year, but shall continue until the purpose for which
4 it was appropriated is completed for a period not to exceed 3 fiscal
5 years. The unexpended balance of any appropriation made in section 101
6 remaining after the purpose for which it was appropriated is completed
7 shall revert to the Michigan natural resources trust fund and be made
8 available for appropriation.

9 Sec. 304. If a person or organization has acquired an option on a
10 parcel of property prior to final determination by the department of nat-
11 ural resources and the Michigan natural resources trust fund board, the
12 property shall not be considered for acquisition unless the department
13 and board can demonstrate that a clear recreational advantage exists in
14 obtaining the parcel of property for the people of the state at a reason-
15 able fair market value.

16 GENERAL SECTIONS FOR FISCAL YEAR 1996-97

17 Sec. 1201. In accordance with the provisions of section 30 of arti-
18 cle IX of the state constitution of 1963, total state spending from state
19 sources for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1997, is \$2,400,000.00
20 and state appropriations to be paid to local units of government in
21 section 102 are \$0.

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1 CAPITAL OUTLAY

2 Sec. 1301. From the funds appropriated in section 101 of 1996 PA
3 363, the department of military and veterans affairs is authorized to
4 purchase that parcel of land on which the hangar facility is located at
5 the Grand Ledge Abrams municipal airport.

6 TREASURY

7 Sec. 1401. (1) Funds appropriated in section 4(b)(1) of 1997 PA 69,
8 for casino gaming, Michigan gaming control board, and casino gaming con-
9 trol administration shall be financed entirely by the state casino gaming
10 fund if sufficient funds are available in the state casino gaming fund.
11 If sufficient funds are not available in the state casino gaming fund,
12 the director of the department of management and budget may make advances
13 from the general fund to fully fund these appropriations in amounts not
14 to exceed those in section 4(b)(1) of 1997 PA 69.

15 (2) Any general fund advances made for casino gaming, Michigan
16 gaming control board, or casino gaming control administration in the
17 fiscal year ending September 30, 1997 shall be reimbursed from the state
18 casino gaming fund with interest in an amount and manner consistent with
19 the operating practices of this state's common cash fund.

20 (3) If general fund advances are made under subsection (1), funds
21 subsequently received in the state casino gaming fund shall be used first
22 to reimburse the general fund before any additional appropriations are
23 made for casino gaming, Michigan gaming control board, or casino gaming
24 control administration.
