- 20 STUDENTS AND CONDITIONED UPON THE FAITHFUL PERFORMANCE AND SATIS-
- 21 FACTION OF THE CONTRACTUAL RIGHTS OF STUDENTS.
- 22 (D) PROVISIONS HAVE BEEN MADE FOR THE SCHOOL TO BE UNDER THE
- 23 DAILY SUPERVISION OF A LICENSED INSTRUCTOR WHO HAS AT LEAST 3
- 24 YEARS' EXPERIENCE IN ALL SERVICES OF COSMETOLOGY BEING TAUGHT IN

- 26 (E) THE PREMISES HAS SUCCESSFULLY PASSED AN INSPECTION BY
