ADDENDUM TO SENATE FISCAL AGENCY ANALYSIS OF SB 120 AND 885 DATED 11-17-99:

## **HOUSE COMMITTEE ACTION:**

The House Committee on Criminal Law and Corrections adopted a substitute, H-1, for <u>Senate Bill 120</u>. The substitute incorporates the following amendments to the Senate-passed version of the bill:

- The substitute makes the prohibition on obtaining personal identity information apply if there is an intent to *unlawfully* use the information for any of the purposes listed in the bill.
- The substitute specifies that the legislation would not apply to a person who obtains or attempts to obtain personal identity information pursuant to the discovery process of a civil action, administrative proceeding, or an arbitration proceeding.
  - The substitute adds a January 1, 2001 effective date.

Further, the committee adopted Substitute H-2 for <u>Senate Bill 885</u>. The substitute contains conflict language to reflect the language enacted in Public Act 279 of 2000, which also amended this section of law. In addition, the committee substitute contains a January 1, 2001 effective date.
