## CONTENT

Senate Bills 1108 and 1109 would amend the Code of Criminal Procedure and the Michigan Penal Code, respectively, to remove penalty provisions for inciting Indians to violate a peace treaty or U.S. law.

Under Section 348 of the Penal Code, it is a felony to incite or attempt to incite any Indian nation, tribe, chief, or individual to violate any peace treaty, disturb the peace, or violate any law of the United States. <u>Senate Bill 1109</u> would repeal Section 348.

Under the sentencing guidelines in the Code of Criminal Procedure, a violation of Section 348 of the Penal Code is a class H offense against public safety, with a four-year statutory maximum sentence. Senate Bill 1108 would delete that provision.

## **FISCAL IMPACT**

Senate Bills 1108 and 1109 would have an indeterminate fiscal impact on State government.

There are no data available to indicate how many offenders a year are convicted of inciting or attempting to incite Indians to violate peace treaties or U.S. laws.
