# SENATE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 4378

A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled "The revised school code," by amending section 1531 (MCL 380.1531), as amended by 1995 PA 289.

#### THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1531. (1) Except as provided in this act, the state
- 2 board SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION shall determine the
- 3 requirements for and issue all licenses and certificates for
- 4 teachers, including preprimary teachers, and the requirements for
- 5 an endorsement of teachers as qualified counselors and an
- 6 endorsement of teachers for teaching a foreign language in an
- 7 elementary grade in the public schools of the state.
- 8 (2) Except as otherwise provided in this act, the state
- 9 board SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION shall only issue a

- 1 teaching certificate to a person who has passed appropriate
- 2 examinations as follows:
- 3 (a) For a secondary level teaching certificate, has passed
- 4 both the basic skills examination and the appropriate available
- 5 subject area examination for each subject area in which he or she
- 6 applies to be certified.
- 7 (b) For an elementary level teaching certificate, has passed
- 8 the basic skills examination and, if it is available, the elemen-
- 9 tary certification examination, and has passed the appropriate
- 10 available subject area examination for each subject area, if any,
- 11 in which he or she applies to be certified.
- 12 (3) Except as otherwise provided in this act, the state
- 13 board SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION shall issue a
- 14 Michigan teaching certificate to a person holding a certificate
- 15 from another state or a teaching degree from an out-of-state
- 16 teacher preparation institution who applies for a Michigan teach-
- 17 ing certificate only if the person passes appropriate examina-
- 18 tions as follows:
- 19 (a) For a secondary level teaching certificate, pass both
- 20 the basic skills examination and the appropriate available
- 21 subject area examination for each subject area in which he or she
- 22 applies to be certified. The state board SUPERINTENDENT OF
- 23 PUBLIC INSTRUCTION may accept passage of an equivalent examina-
- 24 tion approved by the state board SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC
- 25 INSTRUCTION to meet 1 or both of these requirements.
- 26 (b) For an elementary level teaching certificate, pass the
- 27 basic skills examination and, if it is available, the elementary

- 1 certification examination, and pass the appropriate available
- 2 subject area examination for each subject area, if any, in which
- 3 he or she applies to be certified. The state board
- 4 SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION may accept passage of an
- 5 equivalent examination approved by the state board
- 6 SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION to meet 1 or more of these
- 7 requirements.
- 8 (4) EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN THIS ACT, THE SUPERIN-
- 9 TENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION SHALL ONLY ISSUE A TEACHING CERTIF-
- 10 ICATE TO A PERSON WHO HAS MET THE ELEMENTARY OR SECONDARY, AS
- 11 APPLICABLE, READING CREDIT REQUIREMENTS ESTABLISHED UNDER SUPER-
- 12 INTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION RULE. NOT LATER THAN 1 YEAR
- 13 AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE AMENDATORY ACT THAT ADDED THIS
- 14 SUBSECTION, THE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION, IN COOPERA-
- 15 TION WITH APPROPRIATE CURRICULUM SPECIALISTS AND TEACHER EDUCA-
- 16 TORS, SHALL REVISE EXISTING READING STANDARDS TO RECOGNIZE READ-
- 17 ING DISORDERS AND TO ENABLE TEACHERS TO MAKE REFERRALS FOR
- 18 INSTRUCTION AND SUPPORT FOR PUPILS WITH READING DISORDERS.
- 19 (5)  $\overline{(4)}$  Subject to subsection  $\overline{(6)}$  (7), if a person hold-
- 20 ing a teaching certificate from another state applies to the
- 21 state board SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION for a Michigan
- 22 teaching certificate and meets the requirements of this subsec-
- 23 tion, the state board SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION
- 24 shall issue to the person a Michigan professional education
- 25 teaching certificate and applicable endorsements comparable to
- 26 those the person holds in the other state, without requiring the
- 27 person to pass a basic skills examination or the applicable

- 1 subject area examination otherwise required under subsection (2)
- 2 or (3). To be eligible to receive a Michigan professional educa-
- 3 tion teaching certificate under this subsection, a person shall
- 4 provide evidence satisfactory to the department that he or she
- 5 meets all of the following requirements:
- **6** (a) Has taught successfully for at least 3 years in a posi-
- 7 tion for which the person's teaching certification from the other
- 8 state was valid.
- **9** (b) Has earned, after his or her initial certification in
- 10 another state, at least 18 semester credit hours in a planned
- 11 course of study at a state board approved AN institution of
- 12 higher education APPROVED BY THE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC
- 13 INSTRUCTION or has earned, at any time, a state board approved
- 14 master's or doctoral degree APPROVED BY THE SUPERINTENDENT OF
- 15 PUBLIC INSTRUCTION.
- (c) Has met the elementary or secondary, as applicable,
- 17 reading credit requirement established under state board
- 18 SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION rule.
- 19 (6)  $\overline{(5)}$  A person who receives a teaching certificate and
- 20 endorsement or endorsements under subsection -(4) (5) is eligi-
- 21 ble to receive 1 or more additional endorsements comparable to
- 22 endorsements the person holds in another state only if the person
- 23 passes the appropriate subject area examinations required under
- **24** subsection (2) or (3).
- 25 (7) <del>(6)</del> The state board SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC
- 26 INSTRUCTION shall deny a Michigan teaching certificate to a
- 27 person described in subsection  $\frac{(4)}{(5)}$  (5) for fraud, material

- 1 misrepresentation, or concealment in the person's application for
- 2 a certificate or for a conviction for which a person's teaching
- 3 certificate may be revoked under section 1535a.
- 4 (8)  $\frac{(7)}{(7)}$  The department, based upon criteria recommended
- **5** pursuant to subsection  $\frac{(9)}{(10)}$ , shall provide to state board
- 6 approved teacher education institutions state board approved
- 7 guidelines and criteria APPROVED BY THE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC
- 8 INSTRUCTION for use in the development or selection of a basic
- 9 skills examination and approved guidelines and criteria for use
- 10 in the development or selection of subject area examinations.
- 11 (9)  $\overline{(8)}$  For the purposes of this section, the  $\overline{\text{state}}$
- 12 board SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION, based upon criteria
- 13 recommended pursuant to subsection  $\frac{(9)}{(10)}$ , shall develop,
- 14 select, or develop and select 1 or more basic skills examinations
- 15 and subject area examinations. In addition, the state board
- 16 SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION, based upon criteria recom-
- 17 mended pursuant to subsection  $\frac{(9)}{(10)}$ , shall approve an ele-
- 18 mentary certification examination and a reading subject area
- 19 examination.
- 20 (10) <del>(9)</del> The state board SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC
- 21 INSTRUCTION shall appoint an 11-member teacher examination
- 22 advisory committee comprised of representatives of approved
- 23 teacher education institutions and Michigan education organiza-
- 24 tions and associations. Not more than 1/2 of the members com-
- 25 prising this committee shall be certified teachers. This commit-
- 26 tee shall recommend criteria to be used by the state board
- 27 SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION in the development,

- 1 selection, or development and selection of 1 or more basic skills
- 2 examinations, and criteria to be used by the state board
- 3 SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION in the development, selec-
- 4 tion, or development and selection of subject area examinations.
- 5 In addition, the committee shall recommend guidelines for the use
- 6 and administration of those examinations. The basic skills exam-
- 7 inations referred to in this subsection may be developed by the
- 8 state board SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION or selected by
- 9 the state board SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION from com-
- 10 mercially or university developed examinations. In addition, an
- 11 approved teacher education institution, pursuant to guidelines
- 12 and criteria described in subsection -(7) (8), may develop an
- 13 examination at its own expense for approval by the state board
- 14 SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION. An approved teacher educa-
- 15 tion institution that develops its own examination is liable for
- 16 any litigation that results from the use of its examination.
- 17 (11) (10) The state board SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC
- 18 INSTRUCTION shall appoint a 7-member standing technical advisory
- 19 council comprised of persons who are experts in measurement and
- 20 assessment. This council shall advise the state board
- 21 SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION and the teacher examination
- 22 committee on the validity, reliability, and other technical stan-
- 23 dards of the examinations that will be used or are being used and
- 24 of the administration and use of those examinations.
- 25 (12)  $\overline{(11)}$  Not later than November 30 of each year, the
- 26 state board SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION shall submit
- 27 in writing a report on the development or selection and use of

The report shall also contain a 4 financial statement regarding revenue received from the assess-**5** ment of fees levied pursuant to subsection  $\frac{(13)}{(14)}$  (14) and the 6 amount of and any purposes for which that revenue was expended. 7 (13) (12) The basic skills examination, the elementary 8 certification examination, and the subject area examinations 9 required by this section may be taken at different times during 10 an approved teacher preparation program, but the basic skills 11 examination must be passed before a person is enrolled for stu-12 dent teaching and the elementary certification examination and 13 the subject area examinations, as applicable, must be passed 14 before a person is recommended for certification. 15 (14)  $\overline{(13)}$  The department, or if approved by the state 16 board SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION, a private testing 17 service, may assess fees for taking the basic skills examination, 18 elementary certification examination, and the subject area **19** examinations. The fees, which shall be set by the state board 20 SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION, shall not exceed \$50.00 for 21 a basic skills examination or \$75.00 for an elementary certifica-22 tion examination or a subject area examination. - 3 (15)  $\frac{(14)}{(14)}$  If a person holding a teaching certificate from
- 4 another state applies for a Michigan teaching certificate and
- 5 meets all requirements for the Michigan teaching certificate
- 6 except passage of the appropriate examinations under
- 7 subsection (3), the state board SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC
- 8 INSTRUCTION shall issue a nonrenewable temporary teaching certif-
- 9 icate, good for 1 year, to the person. The state board
- 10 SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION shall not issue a Michigan
- 11 teaching certificate to the person after expiration of the tempo-
- 12 rary teaching certificate unless the person passes appropriate
- 13 examinations as described in subsection (3).
- 14 (16)  $\overline{(15)}$  As used in this section:
- 15 (a) "Basic skills examination" means an examination devel-
- 16 oped or selected by the state board SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC
- 17 INSTRUCTION or developed pursuant to subsection  $\frac{(9)}{(10)}$  (10) by an
- 18 approved teacher education institution for the purpose of demon-
- 19 strating the applicant's knowledge and understanding of basic
- 20 language and mathematical skills and other skills necessary for
- 21 the certificate sought, and for determining whether or not an
- 22 applicant is eligible for a provisional Michigan teaching
- 23 certificate.
- 24 (b) "Elementary certification examination" means a compre-
- 25 hensive examination for elementary certification that has been
- 26 developed or selected by the state board SUPERINTENDENT OF
- 27 PUBLIC INSTRUCTION for demonstrating the applicant's knowledge

- 1 and understanding of the core subjects normally taught in
- 2 elementary classrooms and for determining whether or not an
- 3 applicant is eligible for an elementary level teaching
- 4 certificate.
- 5 (c) "Subject area examination" means an examination related
- 6 to a specific area of certification, which examination has been
- 7 developed or selected by the state board SUPERINTENDENT OF
- 8 PUBLIC INSTRUCTION for the purpose of demonstrating the
- 9 applicant's knowledge and understanding of the subject matter and
- 10 determining whether or not an applicant is eligible for a
- 11 Michigan teaching certificate.
- 12 (17) <del>(16)</del> The state board SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC
- 13 INSTRUCTION shall promulgate rules for the implementation of this
- 14 section.
- 15 (18) (17) Notwithstanding any rule promulgated by the
- 16 state board to the contrary, the state board SUPERINTENDENT OF
- 17 PUBLIC INSTRUCTION shall continue to issue state elementary or
- 18 secondary continuing education certificates pursuant to
- 19 R 390.1132(1) of the Michigan administrative code to persons who
- 20 completed the requirements of that rule by December 31, 1992 and
- 21 who apply for that certificate not later than March 15, 1994. If
- 22 the state board SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION has issued
- 23 a state elementary or secondary professional education certifi-
- 24 cate to a person described in this section, the state board
- 25 SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION shall consider the person to
- 26 have a state elementary or secondary, as applicable, continuing
- 27 education certificate.
