- 1 Sec. 8123. (1) The forty-third district consists of the
- 2 cities of Madison Heights, Ferndale, and Hazel Park, is a dis-

- 4 section 8177 or 8178, this district shall be consolidated with
- 5 the fifty-second district and become the fifth division effective

- (b) The term of office for the judge elected in the first 1
- 2 election division of the fifty-second district in the November
- 3 2006 general election shall be 4 years, for that election only.
- (2) The judge serving in the first election division of the
- 5 fifty-second district who is transferred to the second election
- 6 division of the fifty-second district pursuant to this amendatory
- 7 act shall serve as a judge of the second election division of the
- 8 fifty-second district for the balance of the term for which he or
- 9 she was elected or appointed.
- Enacting section 3. This amendatory act does not take
- 11 effect unless Senate Bill No. 769 of the 90th Legislature is
- 12 enacted into law.
