THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 CHAPTER IX
- 2 Sec. 34. (1) The sentencing guidelines promulgated by order 3 of the Michigan supreme court shall not apply to felonies enumer-4 ated in part 2 of chapter XVII committed on or after January 1, 5 1999.
- 6 (2) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection or for a 7 departure from the appropriate minimum sentence range provided
- 8 for under subsection (3), the minimum sentence imposed by a court
- 9 of this state for a felony enumerated in part 2 of chapter XVII
- 10 committed on or after January 1, 1999 shall be within the appro-
- 11 priate sentence range under the version of those sentencing
- 12 guidelines in effect on the date the crime was committed. Both
- 13 of the following apply to minimum sentences under this
- 14 subsection:
- 15 (a) If a statute mandates a minimum sentence for an
- 16 individual sentenced to the jurisdiction of the department of

- 2 that statute. Imposing a mandatory minimum sentence is not a
- 3 departure under this section. If a statute mandates a minimum
- 4 sentence for an individual sentenced to the jurisdiction of the

- 1 (a) An entire record of the sentencing proceedings.
- 2 (b) The presentence investigation report. Any portion of

- 5 (c) Any other reports or documents the sentencing court used
- 6 in imposing sentence.
- 7 (9) An appeal of a sentence under this section does not stay

- 9 (10) If a minimum sentence is within the appropriate guide-
- 10 lines sentence range, the court of appeals shall affirm that sen-
- 11 tence and shall not remand for resentencing absent an error in
- 12 scoring the sentencing guidelines or inaccurate information
- 13 relied upon in determining the defendant's sentence. A party
- 14 shall not raise on appeal an issue challenging the scoring of the
- 15 sentencing guidelines or challenging the accuracy of information

- 18 issue at sentencing, in a proper motion for resentencing, or in a
- 19 proper motion to remand filed in the court of appeals.

- 23 court shall remand the matter to the sentencing judge or another
- 24 trial court judge for resentencing under this chapter.
- 25 (12) Time served on the sentence appealed under this section
- 26 is considered time served on any sentence imposed after remand.
