

# SENATE BILL No. 1277

May 16, 2000, Introduced by Senators SCHUETTE and DUNASKISS and referred to the Committee on Technology and Energy.

A bill to amend 1939 PA 3, entitled

"An act to provide for the regulation and control of public utilities and other services affected with a public interest within this state; to create a public service commission and to prescribe and define its powers and duties; to abolish the Michigan public utilities commission and to confer the powers and duties vested by law therein on the public service commission; to provide for the continuance, transfer, and completion of certain matters and proceedings; to abolish automatic adjustment clauses; to prohibit rate increases without notice and hearing; to qualify residential energy conservation programs permitted under state law for certain federal exemption; to provide for a restructuring of rates for certain utilities; to encourage the utilization of resource recovery facilities; to provide for appeals; to provide appropriations; to declare the effect of this act; to prescribe penalties; and to repeal all acts contrary to this act,"

(MCL 460.1 to 460.8) by adding section 10z.

**THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:**

1           SEC. 10Z. (1) AGGREGATION MAY BE USED FOR THE PURCHASING OF  
2 ELECTRICITY AND RELATED SERVICES FROM AN ALTERNATIVE ELECTRIC  
3 SUPPLIER.

**SB 1277, As Passed Senate, May 24, 2000**

Senate Bill No. 1277 as amended May 24, 2000

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- 1 (2) LOCAL UNITS OF GOVERNMENT. PUBLIC AND PRIVATE SCHOOLS,  
UNIVERSITIES, AND COMMUNITY COLLEGES MAY AGGREGATE FOR THE PURPOSE  
2 OF PURCHASING ELECTRICITY FOR THEMSELVES OR FOR CUSTOMERS WITHIN  
THEIR BOUNDARIES  
3 WITH THE WRITTEN CONSENT OF EACH CUSTOMER AGGREGATED. CUSTOMERS  
4 WITHIN A LOCAL UNIT OF GOVERNMENT SHALL CONTINUE TO HAVE THE  
5 RIGHT TO CHOOSE THEIR ELECTRICITY SUPPLIER AND ARE NOT REQUIRED  
6 TO PURCHASE ELECTRICITY THROUGH THE AGGREGATOR.  
7 (3) AS USED IN THIS SECTION, "AGGREGATION" MEANS THE COMBIN-  
8 ING OF ELECTRIC LOADS OF MULTIPLE RETAIL CUSTOMERS OR A SINGLE  
9 CUSTOMER WITH MULTIPLE SITES TO FACILITATE THE PROVISION OF ELEC-  
10 TRIC SERVICE TO SUCH CUSTOMERS.

Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect unless Senate Bill No. 937 of the 90th Legislature is enacted into law.
