

# HOUSE BILL No. 4305

February 18, 1999, Introduced by Reps. Byl, Pappageorge, Mead, Toy, Kukuk, Caul, Jellema, Godchaux, Cameron Brown, Geiger, Jansen and Scranton and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

## EXECUTIVE BUDGET BILL

A bill to make appropriations for the department of environmental quality for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2000; to provide for the expenditure of those appropriations; to create funds and accounts; to require reports; to prescribe certain powers and duties of certain state agencies and officials; to authorize certain transfers by certain state agencies; and to provide for the disposition of fees and other income received by the various state agencies.

10 **PROVISIONS CONCERNING APPROPRIATIONS**

11 **GENERAL SECTIONS**

12 Sec. 201. (1) Pursuant to section 30 of article IX of the state  
13 constitution of 1963, total state spending under part 1 for fiscal year  
14 1999-2000 is \$251,279,800.00 and state appropriations to be paid to  
15 local units of government are as follows:

24 (2) If it appears to the principal executive officer of a  
25 department or branch that state spending to local units of government  
26 will be less than the amount that was projected to be expended under  
27 subsection (1), the principal executive officer shall immediately give  
28 notice of the approximate shortfall to the state budget director.

29 Sec. 202. The expenditures and funding sources authorized under  
30 this bill are subject to the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431,  
31 MCL 18.1101 to 18.1594.

32 Sec. 203. As used in this bill:

33 (a) "CESARS" means chemical evaluation search and retrieval system.

34 (b) "Department" means the Michigan department of environmental  
35 quality.

(c) "DOC" means the United States department of commerce.

(d) "DOC-NOAA" means the DOC national oceanic and atmospheric administration.

(e) "DOD" means the United States department of defense.

(f) "DOI" means the United States department of interior.

(g) "DOI-OSMRE" means the DOI office of surface mine reclamation.

(h) "DOI-USGS" means the DOI United States geological survey.

(i) "EPA" means the United States environmental protection agency.

(j) "EPA-GWDW" means the EPA groundwater drinking water.

(k) "EPA-LUST trust" means the EPA leaking underground storage tank trust fund.

(l) "EPA-UST" means the EPA underground storage tank.

(m) "EPA-radon" means the EPA radon grants.

(n) "FEMA" means the federal emergency management agency.

(o) "FTE" means full-time equated position.

(p) "GIS" means geographic information system.

(q) "IDG" means interdepartmental grant.

(r) "IDT" means intradepartmental transfer.

(s) "MDCH" means the Michigan department of community health.

(t) "MDSP" means the Michigan department of state police.

(u) "MI" means Michigan.

(v) "MUSTFA" means the Michigan underground storage tank financial assurance fund.

(w) "NPL" means the federal national priority list.

Sec. 203. (1) Beginning October 1, 1999, a hiring freeze is imposed on the state classified civil service. State departments and agencies are prohibited from hiring any new full-time state classified civil service employees and prohibited from filling any vacant state classified civil service positions. This hiring freeze does not apply to internal transfers of classified employees from one position to another within a department or to positions that are funded with 80% or more federal or restricted funds.

(2) The state budget director shall grant exceptions to this hiring freeze when the state budget director believes that the hiring freeze will result in rendering a state department or agency unable to deliver

1 basic services.

2       Sec. 204. The department of civil service shall bill departments  
3 and agencies at the end of the first fiscal quarter for the 1% charge  
4 authorized by section 5 of article XI of the state constitution of  
5 1963. Payments shall be made for the total amount of the billing by  
6 the end of the second fiscal quarter.

7       Sec. 205. (1) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1,  
8 there is appropriated an amount not to exceed \$30,000,000.00 for  
9 federal contingency funds. These funds are not available for  
10 expenditure until they have been transferred to another line item in  
11 this bill pursuant to section 393(2) of the management and budget act,  
12 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1393.

13       (2) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1, there is  
14 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$5,000,000.00 for state restricted  
15 contingency funds. These funds are not available for expenditure until  
16 they have been transferred to another line item in this bill pursuant  
17 to section 393(2) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL  
18 18.1393.

19       (3) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1, there is  
20 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$100,000.00 for local contingency  
21 funds. These funds are not available for expenditure until they have  
22 been transferred to another line item in this bill pursuant to section  
23 393(2) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1393.

24       (4) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1, there is  
25 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$100,000.00 for private  
26 contingency funds. These funds are not available for expenditure until  
27 they have been transferred to another line item in this bill pursuant  
28 to section 393(2) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL  
29 18.1393.

30       Sec. 206. (1) In addition to the funds appropriated for the  
31 environmental cleanup and redevelopment program listed in section 111,  
32 the department of environmental quality is authorized to expend amounts  
33 remaining from prior fiscal year appropriations to meet funding needs  
34 of legislatively approved sites.

35       (2) Unexpended and unencumbered amounts remaining from

1 appropriations from the environmental protection bond fund contained in  
2 1989 PA 180, 1990 PA 55, 1990 PA 194, 1991 PA 31, 1991 PA 160, 1993 PA  
3 74, 1993 PA 353, 1994 PA 442, 1996 PA 353, and 1997 PA 114 are  
4 appropriated for expenditure for any site listed in this bill and any  
5 site listed in the public acts referenced in this subsection.

6 (3) Unexpended and unencumbered amounts remaining from  
7 appropriations from the cleanup and redevelopment fund and unclaimed  
8 bottle deposits fund contained in 1996 PA 319, 1997 PA 113, 1997 PA  
9 114, and 1998 PA 292 are appropriated for expenditure for any site  
10 listed in this bill and any site listed in the public acts referenced  
11 in this subsection.

12 (4) The department of environmental quality shall provide an annual  
13 report by April 1, 2000 to the state budget director, the house and  
14 senate appropriations subcommittees on environmental quality, and the  
15 house and senate fiscal agencies that separately identifies the  
16 expenditures authorized by this section from the revenues available  
17 from the environmental bond fund, the unclaimed bottle deposit fund,  
18 and the cleanup and redevelopment fund.

19 **AIR QUALITY**

20 Sec. 301. From the funds appropriated in section 107, the  
21 department shall report on the status of implementation planning and  
22 permit backlog reduction activities under part 55 of the natural  
23 resources and environmental protection act, 1994 PA 451, MCL 324.5501  
24 to 324.5542, including status of revenue collections, on an annual  
25 basis. The report shall be provided to the house and senate  
26 appropriations subcommittees on environmental quality, the standing  
27 committees of the house of representatives and the senate that are  
28 responsible for issues pertaining to air quality, and the state budget  
29 director on or before March 1, 2000.

30 **ENVIRONMENTAL RESPONSE**

31 Sec. 401. From the appropriation in part 1 for the environmental  
32 cleanup and redevelopment program, the department shall continue to  
33 make authorizations for response activities at environmental  
34 contamination sites and for the administration of the program created  
35 by part 201 of the natural resources and environmental protection act,

1 1994 PA 451, MCL 324.20101 to 324.20142.

2 Sec. 402. The unexpended portion of the appropriation in part 1 for  
3 the state cleanup program, environmental cleanup and redevelopment  
4 program, emergency cleanup action, NPL-municipal landfill match grants,  
5 and superfund cleanup projects is considered work project  
6 appropriations and any unencumbered or unallotted funds are carried  
7 forward into the succeeding fiscal year. The following is in compliance  
8 with section 451(3) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL  
9 18.1451:

10 (a) The purpose of the projects to be carried forward is to provide  
11 contaminated site cleanup.

12 (b) The projects will be accomplished by contract.

13 (c) The total estimated cost of all projects is identified in each  
14 line-item appropriation.

15 (d) The tentative completion date is September 30, 2001.

16 Sec. 403. Of the funds appropriated in section 111 as state match  
17 for the superfund cleanup program, an amount not to exceed \$250,000.00  
18 shall be expended as state match for the hazardous substance research  
19 center.

20 Sec. 404. The department shall report by March 1, 2000, all of the  
21 following information relative to allocations made in section 111 for  
22 the environmental cleanup and redevelopment program, state cleanup,  
23 emergency actions, superfund cleanup, and revitalization revolving loan  
24 fund and the environmental projects under part 195 of the natural  
25 resources and environmental protection act, 1994 PA 451, MCL 324.19508  
26 (7) to the state budget director, the standing committees of the senate  
27 and house of representatives, the senate and house appropriations  
28 subcommittees on environmental quality and the senate and house fiscal  
29 agencies:

30 (a) The name and location of the site for which an allocation is  
31 made.

32 (b) The nature of the problem encountered at the site.

33 (c) A brief description of how the problem will be resolved if the  
34 allocation is made for a response activity.

35 (d) The estimated date of site closure.

36 (e) The amount of the allocation, or the anticipated financing for



1 the site.

2 (f) A summary of the sites and the total amount of funds expended  
3 at the sites at the conclusion of the fiscal year.

4 (g) The number of sites that would qualify as brownfields that were  
5 redeveloped.

6 **STORAGE TANKS**

7 Sec. 501. (1) The funds appropriated in section 112 from the  
8 Michigan underground storage tank financial assurance fund for the  
9 purpose of carrying out the duties and responsibilities as specified in  
10 part 215 of the natural resources and environmental protection act,  
11 1994 PA 451, MCL 324.21501 to 324.21551, are considered work project  
12 appropriations and any unencumbered funds are carried forward into the  
13 succeeding fiscal year. The following is in compliance with section  
14 451(3) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1451:

15 (a) The purpose of the projects to be carried forward is to carry  
16 out the responsibilities of part 215 of the natural resources and  
17 environmental protection act, 1994 PA 451, MCL 324.21501 to 324.21551.

18 (b) The projects will be accomplished by contract and state  
19 employees.

20 (c) The total estimated cost is identified in a line-item  
21 appropriation.

22 (d) The tentative completion date is September 30, 2001.

23 (2) The Michigan underground storage tank financial assurance  
24 policy board shall allocate the amount of the underground storage tank  
25 financial assurance fund to be distributed to the department. If the  
26 amount recommended by the board is less than that appropriated in  
27 section 112, expenditures shall be adjusted accordingly.

28 (3) Included in the amounts appropriated in section 112 from the  
29 Michigan underground storage tank financial assurance fund are amounts  
30 sufficient to pay debt service costs on the bonds or notes issued  
31 pursuant to part 215 of the natural resources and environmental  
32 protection act, 1994 PA 451, MCL 324.21501 to 324.21551.

33 Sec. 502. The department shall provide reports to the state budget  
34 director, the senate and house appropriations subcommittees on  
35 environmental quality and the senate and house fiscal agencies no later  
36 than March 31, 2000, and October 31, 2000, on the Michigan underground

1 storage tank financial assurance fund. Reports shall include the fund  
2 balance, estimate of available revenues, number and dollar value of  
3 claims processed through September 30, 1999, and total estimated claims  
4 liability through December 22, 2001.

5 Sec. 503. The unexpended portion of the appropriation in section  
6 112 for the leaking underground storage tank cleanup program is  
7 considered work project appropriations and any unencumbered or  
8 unallotted funds are carried over into the succeeding fiscal year. The  
9 following is in compliance with section 451(3) of the management and  
10 budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1451:

11 (a) The purpose of the projects to be carried over is to provide  
12 for cleanup of sites of environmental contamination.

13 (b) These projects will be accomplished by contract.

14 (c) The total estimated costs of all projects is identified in each  
15 line-item appropriation.

16 (d) The tentative completion date for these projects is September  
17 30, 2001.

#### 18 **WASTE MANAGEMENT**

19 Sec. 601. (1) The level of revenue appropriated in part 1 of this  
20 bill from environmental pollution prevention fund revenue is contingent  
21 on the enactment into law of amendatory legislation to establish  
22 hazardous waste user fees.

23 (2) The department shall discontinue hazardous waste management  
24 operations and all hazardous waste management program responsibilities  
25 shall revert to the United States environmental protection agency on  
26 October 1, 1999, or when it is determined that the environmental  
27 pollution prevention fund revenue has been fully expended, whichever is  
28 later.

#### 29 **CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIONS**

30 Sec. 701. The department shall provide training in support of  
31 local efforts to regulate solid waste disposal. Department  
32 environmental conservation officers shall be directed to help train law  
33 enforcement officers and other enforcement personnel to develop  
34 community partnerships to combat illegal dumping at the local level.

#### 35 **GRANTS**

1       Sec. 801. If a certified health department does not exist in a  
2 city, county, or district or does not fulfill its responsibilities  
3 under part 117 of the natural resources and environmental protection  
4 act, 1994 PA 451, MCL 324.11701 to 324.11719, then the department may  
5 spend funds appropriated in section 116 under the septage waste  
6 compliance program in accordance with section 11716 of part 117 of the  
7 natural resources and environmental protection act, 1994 PA 451, MCL  
8 324.11716.

9       Sec. 802. Loans provided by the water pollution control revolving  
10 fund pursuant to the appropriation in section 116 are to be repaid on  
11 schedule and penalties shall be assigned for delinquent repayment as  
12 provided in part 53 of the natural resources and environmental  
13 protection act, 1994 PA 451, MCL 324.5301 to 324.5316.

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
