

HOUSE BILL No. 6151

November 28, 2000, Introduced by Rep. Frank and referred to the Committee on House Oversight and Operations.

A bill to designate March 1 of each year as children's memorial day in the state of Michigan.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 (1) The legislature recognizes the great number of
- 2 tragic deaths of schoolchildren from all causes that occur each
- 3 year. Each day in America 6 children and youths under age 20
- 4 commit suicide, 10 children and youths under age 20 are homicide
- 5 victims, and 35 children and youths under age 20 die from
