- 9 (D) "PROTECT THE HEALTH OF CHILDREN" MEANS TO ADEQUATELY

- 1 (i) BASELINE DATA AND ANNUAL UPDATES ON THE HEALTH OF
- 2 CHILDREN AS AFFECTED BY POLLUTION.
- 3 (ii) THE OFFICE'S RECOMMENDATIONS ON POLICIES, RULES, AND
- 4 LAWS NEEDED TO PROTECT THE HEALTH OF CHILDREN.
- 5 (E) REVIEW AND COORDINATE EXISTING RESEARCH CONCERNING THE
- 6 RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN EXPOSURE TO POLLUTION AND CHILDREN'S
- 7 HEALTH.
- **8** (F) IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY HEALTH,
- 9 DEVELOP AND UPDATE BIENNIALLY A RESEARCH AGENDA TO ADDRESS UNRE-
- 10 SOLVED SCIENTIFIC CONCERNS ABOUT THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN EXPO-
- 11 SURE TO POLLUTION AND CHILDREN'S HEALTH.
- 12 (G) DEVELOP AND COORDINATE A PUBLIC EDUCATION PROGRAM TO
- 13 MAKE PARENTS, GUARDIANS, AND OTHER CAREGIVERS AWARE OF THE POTEN-
- 14 TIAL HEALTH EFFECTS TO CHILDREN CAUSED BY EXPOSURE TO POLLUTION
- 15 AND OF RECOMMENDATIONS TO MINIMIZE SUCH EXPOSURE.
- 16 (3) IF, BASED ON EXISTING RESEARCH, THE OFFICE IS UNABLE TO
- 17 MAKE A DETERMINATION UNDER SUBSECTION (2)(A), (B), OR (C), THE
- 18 OFFICE SHALL IDENTIFY AND PROPOSE ADDITIONAL RESEARCH NECESSARY
- 19 FOR THE OFFICE TO MAKE THE DETERMINATION.
