House Bill 4089 would amend sections 3, 6, and 7 of Public Act 357 of 1968, the State Officers Compensation Commission Act. The amendments would do the following: require the State Officers Compensation Commission (SOCC) to meet January 1, 2002 and every two years thereafter; include within the authority of SOCC the compensation for the Attorney General and the Secretary of State; require SOCC to file its determinations on February 15, 2002 and every two years thereafter; require SOCC to also furnish copies of its determinations to the Attorney General and the Secretary of State; require the adoption of separate concurrent resolutions, one for each the Executive, Judicial, and Legislative branches of government, by a majority vote of the Legislature, in order for determinations of SOCC to become effective; require the Senate to originate the concurrent resolutions and to vote first on each separate resolution beginning in 2002 and every four years after; require the House of Representatives to originate the concurrent resolutions and to vote first on each separate resolution beginning in 2004 and every four years after; require the concurrent resolutions to be voted on by the first house on or before March 15, and then those resolutions receiving an affirmative vote in the first house to be voted on by the second house on or before April 15; and require SOCC determinations to become effective for the legislative session immediately following the next general election.

The bill would be tie-barred to the passage of the House or Senate Joint Resolution which amends the State Constitution, and would become effective on January 1, 2002.

House Bill 4089 would have no fiscal impact on the state, nor on local units of government.
