A SUMMARY OF HOUSE BILL 4124 AS INTRODUCED 1-31-01

Generally, under the Public Health Code, health facilities and agencies are licensed for one year at a time. (There are some exceptions.) <u>House Bill 4124</u> would amend the code to specify that a license for a nursing home would be valid for not more than six months after the occurrence of certain events, including:

- * execution of a new Medicaid provider agreement;
- * transfer of ownership of the nursing home; and
- * issuance of a certificate of need to begin the operation of a new nursing home or to the transferee of ownership of a nursing home.

Except under the above-noted circumstances, the term of licensure of a nursing home would be one year.
