INCREASE PENALTIES FOR USE OF FIREARM IN COMMISSION OF A CRIME

A SUMMARY OF HOUSE BILL 4549 AS INTRODUCED 3-29-01

The Michigan Penal Code imposes a mandatory sentence on persons who carry or possess a firearm at the time they commit or attempt to commit a felony (unless the felony itself is that of carrying a concealed weapon). This mandatory term of imprisonment cannot be suspended, and must be served prior to any sentence imposed for the conviction of the associated felony. Further, a person sentenced under this provision is not eligible for parole or probation during the mandatory term of imprisonment.

<u>House Bill 4549</u> would increase the mandatory prison sentences under this provision. For a first conviction, the sentence would be increased from two to five years. For a second conviction, the sentence would be increased from five to ten years, and for a third or subsequent conviction, from ten to fifteen years.
