SUMMARY

House Bill 4226 would permit the display on public property of a document or other object that contains the Ten Commandments if all of the following circumstances are met: it is displayed with other documents, public records, or objects of historical significance that have formed and influenced the legal or governmental system of the United States; it is displayed in the same manner as other documents, public records, or objects that are displayed at the same time and location; and the display does not focus more attention on it than on other documents, public records, or other objects that are displayed at the same time and location.

House Bill 4226 would have no fiscal impact on the state nor on local units of government.
