- 16 (11) A WRITING PREPARED, OWNED, USED, IN THE POSSESSION OF,
- 17 OR RETAINED BY THE COMMISSION IN THE PERFORMANCE OF AN OFFICIAL
- 18 FUNCTION IS SUBJECT TO THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT, 1976 PA
- 19 442, MCL 15.231 TO 15.246, EXCEPT THAT CONFIDENTIAL MEDICAL,
- 20 SOCIAL, PERSONAL, OR FINANCIAL INFORMATION IDENTIFYING A PATIENT
- 21 IS NOT AVAILABLE FOR PUBLIC INSPECTION IN A MANNER THAT IDENTI-
- 22 FIES THE PATIENT.
- 23 (12) MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION SHALL SERVE WITHOUT
