THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 9307. (1) A conservation district board shall consist
 2of 5 directors, elected or appointed as provided in this part.
 3The directors shall designate a chairperson annually.
- 4 (2) The term of office of each director shall be 4 years.

 5All directors shall be elected at an annual meeting by residents
 6of the district. The election shall be nonpartisan and the
 7directors shall be elected by the residents of the district at
 8large. At least 60 days prior to the annual meeting, a candidate
 9for conservation district director must file at the conservation
 10district office —, a petition signed by 5 residents of the

1district. A candidate must be a resident of the district. 2annual meeting shall be held within 30 days following the close 3of the fiscal year of the district. The fiscal year of the dis-4trict shall be AT A DATE determined by the board of directors of 5the district. Notice of the annual meeting shall be published in 6the official newspaper of record for the area in which the dis-7trict is located at least 45 days prior to the date of the annual 8 meeting. This notice shall include the date, time, and location 9of the annual meeting, an agenda of items to be considered at the 10 meeting, and a list of all candidates for directors of the con-11 servation district. A resident of a district who is unable to 12 attend the annual meeting may vote for the directors of the con-13 servation district by absentee ballot at the conservation dis-14 trict office, during regular business hours of the conservation 15district office, at any time after publication of the notice and 16prior to the annual meeting. Director elections shall be certi-17 fied by the department. A director shall hold office until a 18 successor has been elected and qualified. Vacancies shall be 19 filled by appointment by the board until the next annual 20meeting.

21 (3) A majority of the directors constitutes a quorum, and 22the concurrence of a majority in any matter within their duties 23is required for its determination. A director is entitled to 24expenses, including traveling expenses necessarily incurred in 25the discharge of his or her duties. A director may be paid a per 26diem for time spent undertaking his or her duties as a director

- 4 and such other officers, agents, and employees, permanent and 5temporary, as they may require, and shall determine their qualifications, duties, and compensation. The directors may call upon 7the attorney general of the state for legal services as they may 8require. The directors may delegate to their chairperson, to 1 9or more directors, or to 1 or more agents or employees any powers 10 and duties that they consider proper. The directors shall fur-11 nish to the department, upon request, copies of ordinances, 12 rules, regulations, orders, contracts, forms, and other documents 13 that they adopt or employ, and any other information concerning 14 their activities that the department may require in the per-15 formance of its duties under this part.
- 16 (5) The directors shall provide DO ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
 17 (A) PROVIDE for the execution of surety bonds for all
 18employees and officers who are entrusted with funds or property.

- 20 (B) PROVIDE for the keeping of a full and accurate record of
 21all proceedings and of all resolutions, regulations, and orders
 22issued or adopted. ; shall provide
 - 23 (C) DETERMINE THE FISCAL YEAR OF THE DISTRICT.
- 24 (D) PROVIDE for an annual audit of the accounts of receipts
 25and disbursements. ; and shall maintain

- 1 (E) MAINTAIN accurate financial records of receipts and 2disbursements of state funds, which records shall be made 3available to the department.
- 4 (6) Any director may be removed by the department upon
 5notice and hearing for neglect of duty or malfeasance in office,
 6but for no other reason.
- 7 (7) (6) The directors may invite the legislative body of 8any municipality or county located near the territory comprised 9within the district to designate a representative to advise and 10consult with the directors of the district on all questions of 11program and policy that may affect the property, water supply, or 12other interests of the municipality or county.
