## A bill to amend 1953 PA 181, entitled

"An act relative to investigations in certain instances of the causes of death within this state due to violence, negligence or other act or omission of a criminal nature or to protect public health; to provide for the taking of statements from injured persons under certain circumstances; to abolish the office of coroner and to create the office of county medical examiner in certain counties; to prescribe the powers and duties of county medical examiners; to prescribe penalties for violations of the provisions of this act; and to prescribe a referendum thereon,"

by amending section 1 (MCL 52.201); and to repeal acts and parts of acts.

#### THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. (1) The board of <del>supervisors</del> COMMISSIONERS of
- 2 each county of this state shall by resolution abolish the office
- 3 of coroner -, and appoint a county medical examiner to hold
- 4 office for a period of 4 years. —Should—IF the office of county
- 5 medical examiner become BECOMES vacant before the expiration of
- 6 the term of office, the board of supervisors COMMISSIONERS may
- 7 appoint a successor to complete the term of office. In counties

- 1 having WITH a civil service system, the appointment and tenure

- (2) County medical examiners shall be physicians licensed to
- 5 practice within the THIS state. and shall be residents of the

- (3) Two or more <del>adjoining</del> counties, by resolution of the
- 8 respective boards of supervisors thereof COMMISSIONERS, may
- 9 enter into <del>common</del> AN agreement to employ the same person to act
- 10 as medical examiner for all of the counties.
