- 9 priced and of comparable value.
- 10 Sec. 210. The director of each department receiving appropriations
- 11 in part 1 shall take all reasonable steps to ensure businesses in
- 12 deprived and depressed communities compete for and perform contracts to

- 20 maintain a sex offenders registry website on the Internet. The website
- 21 shall be capable of being linked to and immediately be accessible from
- 22 the websites of public officials, including legislators. The sex offend-
- 23 ers registry website shall contain a listing of all those persons in the
- 24 state convicted of a sex offense and required to be registered with the
- 25 state under the sex offenders registration act, 1994 PA 295, MCL 28.721
