## SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 334

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled "Michigan vehicle code,"

by amending section 710e (MCL 257.710e), as amended by 1999 PA 29.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 710e. (1) This section does not apply to a driver or
- 2 passenger of any of the following:
- 3 (a) A motor vehicle manufactured before January 1, 1965.
- 4 (b) A bus.
- 5 (c) A motorcycle.
- 6 (d) A moped.
- 7 (e) A motor vehicle if the driver or passenger possesses a
- 8 written verification from a physician that the driver or
- 9 passenger is unable to wear a safety belt for physical or medical
- 10 reasons.

1 (f) A motor vehicle that is not required to be equipped with

- 2 safety belts under federal law.
- 3 (g) A commercial or United States postal service vehicle
- 4 that makes frequent stops for the purpose of pickup or delivery
- 5 of goods or services.
- **6** (h) A motor vehicle operated by a rural carrier of the
- 7 United States postal service while serving his or her rural
- 8 postal route.
- **9** (2) This section does not apply to a passenger of a school
- 10 bus.
- 11 (3) Each driver and front seat passenger of a motor vehicle
- 12 operated on a street or highway in this state shall wear a prop-
- 13 erly adjusted and fastened safety belt, except that a child less
- 14 than 4 years of age shall be protected as required in section
- 15 710d. If there are more passengers 16 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER than
- 16 THERE ARE safety belts available for use, and all safety belts in
- 17 the motor vehicle are being utilized in compliance with this sec-
- 18 tion, the driver of the motor vehicle is in compliance with this
- 19 section.
- 20 (4) Each driver of a motor vehicle transporting a child
- 21 4 years of age or more but less than 16 years of age in a motor
- 22 vehicle shall secure the child in a properly adjusted and
- 23 fastened safety belt. If the motor vehicle is transporting more
- 24 children than there are safety belts available for use, all
- 25 safety belts available in the motor vehicle are being utilized in
- 26 compliance with this section, and the driver and all front seat
- 27 passengers comply with subsection (3), then the driver of a motor

1 vehicle transporting a child 4 years of age or more but less than

- 2 16 years of age for which there is not an available safety belt
- 3 is in compliance with this subsection, if that child is seated in
- 4 other than the front seat of the motor vehicle. However, if that
- 5 motor vehicle is a pickup truck without an extended cab or jump
- 6 seats, and all safety belts in the front seat are being used, the
- 7 driver may transport such a child in the front seat without a
- 8 safety belt.
- **9** (5) If after December 31, 2005 the office of highway safety
- 10 planning certifies that there has been less than 80% compliance
- 11 with the safety belt requirements of this section during the pre-
- 12 ceding year, then enforcement of this section by state or local
- 13 law enforcement agencies shall be accomplished only as a second-
- 14 ary action when a driver of a motor vehicle has been detained for
- 15 a suspected violation of another section of this act.
- 16 (6) Failure to wear a safety belt in violation of this sec-
- 17 tion may be considered evidence of negligence and may reduce the
- 18 recovery for damages arising out of the ownership, maintenance,
- 19 or operation of a motor vehicle. However, such negligence shall
- 20 not reduce the recovery for damages by more than 5%.
- 21 (7) A person who violates this section is responsible for a
- 22 civil infraction.
- 23 (8) A law enforcement agency shall conduct an investigation
- 24 for all reports of police harassment that result from the
- 25 enforcement of this section.
- 26 (9) The secretary of state shall engage an independent
- 27 organization to conduct a 3-year study to determine the effect

- 1 that the primary enforcement of this section has on the number of
- 2 incidents of police harassment of drivers. The organization that
- 3 conducts the study shall submit a report to the legislature not
- 4 later than June 30, 2001 and an annual report not later than June
- 5 30 each year thereafter.
- 6 (10) The secretary of state shall promote compliance with
- 7 the safety belt requirements of this section at the branch
- 8 offices and through any print or visual media determined appro-
- 9 priate by the secretary of state.
- 10 (11) The secretary of state shall conduct a study with the
- 11 cooperation and contribution of the directors of the department
- 12 of state police, the department of community health, the state
- 13 transportation department, and the insurance bureau to analyze
- 14 the monetary savings, if any, arising from the enactment of the
- 15 amendatory act that added this subsection. The secretary of
- 16 state shall report the findings of the study to all of the fol-
- 17 lowing not later than May 1, 2000:
- 18 (a) The senate and house of representatives appropriations
- 19 committees.
- (b) The senate and house of representatives fiscal
- 21 agencies.
- 22 (12) It is the intent of the legislature that the enforce-
- 23 ment of this section be conducted in a manner calculated to save
- 24 lives and not in a manner that results in the harassment of the
- 25 citizens of this state.
- 26 (13) Points shall not be assessed under section 320a for a
- 27 violation of this section.
