- 18 INVESTIGATORS FOR INVESTIGATION OF COMPLAINTS OF BOTH PHYSICAL
- 19 ABUSE OR NEGLECT AND FINANCIAL ABUSE OR NEGLECT. THE GUARDIAN-
- 20 SHIP OMBUDSMAN SHALL HIRE AN INDIVIDUAL WITH TRAINING AND
- 21 EXPERIENCE IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS.
- 22 SEC. 5123. IF A GUARDIANSHIP OMBUDSMAN'S INVESTIGATION OF A
- 23 COMPLAINT REVEALS EVIDENCE THAT WARRANTS FURTHER ACTION BEYOND AN
- 24 INVESTIGATION, THE GUARDIANSHIP OMBUDSMAN SHALL REFER THE COM-
- 25 PLAINT TO THE APPROPRIATE AGENCY, SUCH AS THE COURT, THE ATTORNEY
- 26 GENERAL, A PROSECUTING ATTORNEY, AN ENTITY THAT RECEIVES
