- 6 identification may be torn off. The detachable corner stub shall

2 be printed upon the stub on 1 side only. A political party des-
3 ignation shall not appear upon a ballot corner -so THAT IS num-

6 mary election in the same manner as is now provided by law for
7 the distribution of ballots to be used at general elections.
