- 1 Sec. 1233b. (1) Except as provided in subsection (3), the
- 2 board of a local or intermediate school district OR BOARD OF

- 4 part-time noncertificated, nonendorsed teacher to teach a course
- 5 in computer science, a foreign language, mathematics, biology,
- 6 chemistry, engineering, physics, robotics, or in another subject
- 7 area determined by the state board to be appropriate to be
- 8 included under this section and so designated by the state board,
- 9 or any combination of these subject areas, in grades -9 7

- 3 (2) Subject to subsection (3), a noncertificated, nonen-

- (D) REQUIRES PASSAGE OF A SUBJECT AREA EXAMINATION, IF AN 15
- 16 APPLICABLE SUBJECT AREA EXAMINATION EXISTS, IN THE SUBJECT AREA
- 17 IN WHICH THE TEACHER HOLDS A MASTER'S OR DOCTORATE DEGREE.
