## **HOUSE BILL No. 5762**

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled "Michigan vehicle code," by amending section 707e (MCL 257.707e).

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 707e. (1) Test instrumentation and procedures used
- 2 for implementation and enforcement of sections 707a to 707d shall
- 3 substantially conform with applicable standards and recommended
- 4 practices established by the society of automotive engineers,
- 5 inc., and the American national standards institute, inc., for
- 6 the measurement of motor vehicle sound levels. Rules establish-
