A bill to amend 1939 PA 280, entitled "The social welfare act," (MCL 400.1 to 400.119b) by adding section 109h.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 SEC. 109H. (1) BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2003, THE DEPARTMENT OF
- 2 COMMUNITY HEALTH SHALL PROVIDE COVERAGE FOR LOW-PROTEIN MODIFIED
- 3 FOOD PRODUCTS SUBJECT TO BOTH OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 4 (A) THE LOW-PROTEIN MODIFIED FOOD PRODUCTS ARE PRESCRIBED

 5 FOR THE THERAPEUTIC TREATMENT OF AMINO ACID DISORDERS.
 - (B) THE LOW-PROTEIN MODIFIED FOOD PRODUCTS ARE ADMINISTERED UNDER THE DIRECTION OF A PHYSICIAN.
 - (2) COVERAGE UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL NOT HAVE DEDUCTIBLES
 AND COPAYMENT PROVISIONS THAT ARE LESS FAVORABLE THAN THOSE FOR
 PRESCRIPTION COVERAGE GENERALLY. COVERAGE UNDER THIS SECTION MAY
 BE LIMITED TO A CAP OF \$4,000.00 PER PLAN YEAR ON BOTH INDIVIDUAL

- 12 PER SERVING. LOW-PROTEIN MODIFIED FOOD PRODUCT DOES NOT INCLUDE
- 13 A NATURAL FOOD THAT IS NATURALLY LOW IN PROTEIN.
