



# SENATE BILL No. 238

February 21, 2001, Introduced by Senators HOFFMAN, NORTH, GOUGEON, JOHNSON, MC MANUS and GOSCHKA and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

## EXECUTIVE BUDGET BILL

A bill to make appropriations for the department of state police and certain other state purposes for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2002; to provide for the expenditure of those appropriations; to provide for certain reports and the consideration of those reports; to provide for the disposition of other income received by the various state agencies; to provide for the testing of certain persons; to provide for certain emergency powers; and to provide for the powers and duties of certain committees, certain state agencies, and certain employees.

24 Sec. 201. Pursuant to section 30 of article IX of the state  
 25 constitution of 1963, total state spending from state resources under  
 26 part 1 for fiscal year 2001-2002 is \$354,493,200.00 and state spending  
 27 from state resources to be paid to local units of government for  
 28 fiscal year 2001-2002 is \$20,081,300.00. The itemized statement below

17 Sec. 202. The appropriations authorized under this bill are

20 Sec. 203. As used in this bill:

21 (a) "AFIS" means the automated fingerprint identification system.

22 (b) "COLES" means the commission on law enforcement standards.

23 (c) "Department" means the department of state police.

24 (d) "DNA" means deoxyribonucleic acid.

25 (e) "DOJ" means the United States department of justice.

26 (f) "DOJ-BJA" means the DOJ bureau of justice assistance.

27 (g) "DOJ-BJS" means the DOJ bureau of justice statistics.

28 (h) "DOJ-COPS" means the DOJ community oriented policing services.

29 (i) "DOJ-OJJDP" means the DOJ office of juvenile justice and

30 delinquency prevention.

1 (j) "DOJ-OJP" means the DOJ office of justice programs.

2 (k) "DOL" means the United States department of labor.

3 (l) "DOL-ETA" means the DOL employment and training  
4 administration.

5 (m) "DOT" means the United States department of transportation.

6 (n) "DOT-NHTSA" means DOT national highway traffic safety  
7 administration.

8 (o) "DOT-RSPA" means the DOT research and special programs  
9 administration.

10 (p) "FEMA" means the federal emergency management agency.

11 (q) "FEMA-PTED" means the FEMA preparedness, training, and  
12 exercises directorate.

13 (r) "FTE" means full-time equated.

14 (s) "IDG" means interdepartmental grant.

15 (t) "IDT" means intradepartmental transfer.

16 (u) "LEIN" means law enforcement information network.

17 (v) "MDCH" means the Michigan department of community health.

18 (w) "MDMB" means the Michigan department of management and budget.

19 (x) "MDOC" means the Michigan department of corrections.

20 (y) "MDOS" means the Michigan department of state.

21 (z) "MDOT" means the Michigan department of transportation.

22 (aa) "MDTR" means the Michigan department of treasury.

23 Sec. 204. The department of civil service shall bill departments  
24 and agencies at the end of the first fiscal quarter for the 1% charge  
25 authorized by section 5 of article XI of the state constitution of  
26 1963. Payments shall be made for the total amount of the billing by  
27 the end of the second fiscal quarter.

28 Sec. 205. (1) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1,  
29 there is appropriated an amount not to exceed \$10,000,000.00 for  
30 federal contingency funds. These funds are not available for

1 expenditure until they have been transferred to another line item in  
2 this bill under section 393(2) of the management and budget act, 1984  
3 PA 431, MCL 18.1393.

4 (2) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1, there is  
5 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$3,500,000.00 for state  
6 restricted contingency funds. These funds are not available for  
7 expenditure until they have been transferred to another line item in  
8 this bill under section 393(2) of the management and budget act, 1984  
9 PA 431, MCL 18.1393.

10 (3) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1, there is  
11 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$1,000,000.00 for local  
12 contingency funds. These funds are not available for expenditure  
13 until they have been transferred to another line item in this bill  
14 under section 393(2) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431,  
15 MCL 18.1393.

16 (4) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1, there is  
17 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$200,000.00 for private  
18 contingency funds. These funds are not available for expenditure  
19 until they have been transferred to another line item in this bill  
20 under section 393(2) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431,  
21 MCL 18.1393.

22 Sec. 206. Unless otherwise specified, the department shall use  
23 the Internet to fulfill the reporting requirements of this bill. This  
24 may include transmission of reports via electronic mail to the  
25 recipients identified for each reporting requirement, or it may  
26 include placement of reports on an Internet or Intranet site.  
27 Quarterly, the department shall provide to the appropriations  
28 subcommittee members, state budget office, and the fiscal agencies an  
29 electronic and paper copy listing of the reports submitted during the  
30 most recent 3-month period along with the Internet or Intranet site of

1 each report, if any.

2 Sec. 207. (1) A hiring freeze is imposed on the state classified  
3 civil service. State departments and agencies are prohibited from  
4 hiring any new full-time state classified civil service employees and  
5 prohibited from filling any vacant state classified civil service  
6 positions. This hiring freeze does not apply to internal transfers of  
7 classified employees from one position to another within a department.

8 (2) The state budget director shall grant exceptions to this  
9 hiring freeze when the state budget director believes that the hiring  
10 freeze will result in rendering a state department or agency unable to  
11 deliver basic services, cause loss of revenue to the state, result in  
12 the inability of the state to receive federal funds, or would  
13 necessitate additional expenditures that exceed any savings from  
14 maintaining a vacancy. The state budget director shall report by the  
15 thirtieth of each month to the chairpersons of the senate and house  
16 standing committees on appropriations the number of exceptions to the  
17 hiring freeze approved during the previous month and the reasons to  
18 justify the exception.

19 Sec. 208. (1) The negative appropriation for budgetary savings in  
20 part 1 shall be satisfied by savings from the hiring freeze imposed in  
21 Section 207 and, if necessary, by other savings identified by the  
22 department director and approved by the state budget director.

23 (2) Appropriation authorizations shall be adjusted after the  
24 approval of transfers by the legislature pursuant to section 393(2) of  
25 the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1393.

26 Sec. 209. Of the state general fund/general purpose revenue  
27 appropriated in this bill, \$98,252,500.00 represents a state spending  
28 increase over the amount provided to the department of state police  
29 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1994, and may be used to meet  
30 state match requirements of programs contained in the violent crime

1 control and law enforcement act of 1994, Public Law 103-322, 108 Stat.  
2 1796, or successor grant programs, so that any additional federal  
3 money received supplements funding provided to the department of state  
4 police in this bill.

5 **SUPPORT SERVICES**

6 Sec. 301. (1) Money appropriated under part 1 for the Michigan  
7 public safety communications system shall be expended upon approval of  
8 an expenditure plan by the state budget director.

9 (2) The department of state police shall assess all subscribers of  
10 the Michigan public safety communications system reasonable access and  
11 maintenance fees.

12 (3) All money received by the department of state police under  
13 this section shall be deposited to the state general fund pursuant to  
14 section 443 of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL  
15 18.1443.

16 (4) The department of state police shall provide a report to the  
17 house and senate appropriations committees, house and senate fiscal  
18 agencies, and the state budget director on April 15, 2002, and on  
19 October 15, 2002, indicating the amount of revenue collected under  
20 this section and deposited to the state general fund for the  
21 immediately preceding 6-month period.

22 **CRIMINAL JUSTICE DATA CENTER**

23 Sec. 401. The money appropriated in part 1 for computer services  
24 shall be funded by LEIN user fees sufficient to pay 1/3 of the service  
25 and contract maintenance costs of the LEIN mainframe computer system.

26 **FORENSIC SCIENCES**

27 Sec. 501. The grant to the city of Detroit under part 1 shall be  
28 allocated by the city to the Detroit crime lab and to the Detroit  
29 police special events.

30 **COMMISSION ON LAW ENFORCEMENT STANDARDS**



1       Sec. 601. The money appropriated to the COLES for maintenance and  
2 delivery of training to locals is provided in accordance with a state  
3 reimbursement policy in which 100% of the determined state  
4 reimbursement rate shall be distributed upon certification by the  
5 COLES.

6       **EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT**

7       Sec. 701. (1) The state director of emergency management may  
8 expend money appropriated under this bill to call upon any agency or  
9 department of the state or any resource of the state to protect life  
10 or property or to provide for the health or safety of the population  
11 in any area of the state in which the governor proclaims a state of  
12 emergency or state of disaster under 1945 PA 302, MCL 10.31 to 10.33,  
13 or under the emergency management act, 1976 PA 390, MCL 30.401  
14 to 30.420. The state director of emergency management may expend the  
15 amounts the director considers necessary to accomplish these purposes.  
16 The director shall submit to the state budget director, as soon as  
17 possible, a complete report of all actions taken under the authority  
18 of this section. The report shall contain, as a separate item, a  
19 statement of all money expended that is not reimbursable from federal  
20 money. The state budget director shall review the expenditures  
21 and submit recommendations to the legislature in regard to any  
22 possible need for a supplemental appropriation.

23       (2) In addition to the money appropriated in this bill, the  
24 department may receive and expend money from local, private, federal,  
25 or state sources for the purpose of providing emergency management  
26 training to local or private interests and for the purpose of  
27 supporting emergency preparedness, response, recovery, and mitigation  
28 activity.

29       **UNIFORM SERVICES**

30       Sec. 801. The department shall not expend any portion of the

1 money appropriated in this bill, including any expenditure made under  
2 an executive order, to plan for or to implement a roadblock or check  
3 lane system that has as its primary objective the deterrence or  
4 detection of intoxicated drivers in this state.

5 Sec. 802. State police enlisted personnel who are employed to  
6 enforce traffic laws as provided in section 629e of the Michigan  
7 vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.629e, shall not be prohibited from  
8 responding to crimes in progress or other emergency situations, and  
9 are responsible for protecting every citizen of this state from harm.

10 **SPECIAL OPERATIONS**

11 Sec. 901. In addition to the appropriations in part 1 to the  
12 department of state police for the aviation program, the department is  
13 authorized to sell its aircraft and the proceeds from the sale are  
14 appropriated and may be applied to the renovation cost of replacement  
15 aircraft.
