## **SENATE BILL No. 455**

May 3, 2001, Introduced by Senator HOFFMAN and referred to the Committee on Transportation and Tourism.

A bill to amend 1963 PA 181, entitled "Motor carrier safety act of 1963," by amending sections 2v and 2w (MCL 480.12v and 480.12w), as amended by 1995 PA 265.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 2v. (1) A motor carrier shall not permit or require a
- 2 driver of a commercial motor vehicle, regardless of the number of
- 3 motor carriers using the driver's services, to drive for any
- 4 period after having been on duty 60 hours in any 7 consecutive
- 5 days if the employing motor carrier does not operate every day in
- 6 the week, or having been on duty 70 hours in any period of 8 con-
- 7 secutive days if the employing motor carrier operates commercial
- 8 motor vehicles every day of the week.

- 2 drivers if their total driving time does not exceed 40 hours in
