EXECUTIVE BUDGET BILL

A bill to make appropriations for the department of history, arts and libraries and certain other state purposes for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2003; to provide for the expenditure of those appropriations; to provide for the imposition of certain fees; to provide for the disposition of fees and other income received by the state agencies; to provide for reports to certain persons; and to prescribe powers and duties of certain state departments and certain state and local agencies and officers.

22	Sec. 201. Pursuant to section 30 of article IX of the state
23	constitution of 1963, total state spending from state resources
24	under part 1 for fiscal year 2002-2003 is \$64,576,200.00 and state
25	spending from state resources to be paid to local units of
26	government for fiscal year 2002-2003 is \$32,668,200.00. The
27	itemized statement below identifies appropriations from which

1 DEPARTMENT OF HISTORY, ARTS AND LIBRARIES

- 7 Wayne County library for the blind and physically

- 10 Total department of history, arts and
- 12 Sec. 202. The appropriations authorized under this bill are
- 13 subject to the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1101
- 14 to 18.1594.
- 15 Sec. 203. As used in this bill:
- 16 (a) "Department" means the department of history, arts and
- 17 libraries.
- 18 (b) "Director" means the director of the department of history,
- 19 arts and libraries.
- 20 (c) "DOI-NPS" means the United States department of interior,
- 21 national park service.
- 22 (d) "Fiscal agencies" means Michigan house fiscal agency and
- 23 Michigan senate fiscal agency.
- 24 (e) "FTE" means full-time equated.
- 25 (f) "NEA" means the national endowment for the arts.
- 26 (g) "Subcommittees" means all members of the appropriate
- 27 subcommittees of the house and senate appropriations subcommittees.
- 28 Sec. 204. The department of civil service shall bill

- 1 departments and agencies at the end of the first fiscal quarter for
- 2 the 1% charge authorized by section 5 of article XI of the state
- 3 constitution of 1963. Payments shall be made for the total amount
- 4 of the billing by the end of the second fiscal quarter.
- 5 Sec. 205. (1) A hiring freeze is imposed on the state
- 6 classified civil service. State departments and agencies are
- 7 prohibited from hiring any new full-time state classified civil
- 8 service employees and prohibited from filling any vacant state
- 9 classified civil service positions. This hiring freeze does not
- 10 apply to internal transfers of classified employees from one
- 11 position to another within a department.
- (2) The state budget director shall grant exceptions to this
- 13 hiring freeze when the state budget director believes that the
- 14 hiring freeze will result in rendering a state department or agency
- 15 unable to deliver basic services, cause loss of revenue to the
- 16 state, result in the inability of the state to receive federal
- 17 funds, or would necessitate additional expenditures that exceed any
- 18 savings from maintaining a vacancy. The state budget director
- 19 shall report quarterly to the chairpersons of the senate and house
- 20 standing committees on appropriations the number of exceptions to

- 23 Sec. 206. (1) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1,
- 24 there is appropriated an amount not to exceed \$1,000,000.00 for
- 25 federal contingency funds. These funds are not available for
- 26 expenditure until they have been transferred to another line item
- 27 in this bill under section 393(2) of the management and budget act,
- 28 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1393.

- 1 (2) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1, there is
- 2 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$1,000,000.00 for state
- 3 restricted contingency funds. These funds are not available for
- 4 expenditure until they have been transferred to another line item
- 5 in this bill under section 393(2) of the management and budget act,
- 6 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1393.
- 7 (3) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1, there is
- 8 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$100,000.00 for local
- 9 contingency funds. These funds are not available for expenditure
- 10 until they have been transferred to another line item in this bill
- 11 under section 393(2) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431,
- **12** MCL 18.1393.
- 13 (4) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1, there is
- 14 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$750,000.00 for private
- 15 contingency funds. These funds are not available for expenditure
- 16 until they have been transferred to another line item in this bill
- 17 under section 393(2) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431,
- **18** MCI 18.1393.
- 19 Sec. 208. Unless otherwise specified, the department shall use
- 20 the Internet to fulfill the reporting requirements of this bill.
- 21 This may include transmission of reports via electronic mail to the
- 22 recipients identified for each reporting requirement or it may
- 23 include placement of reports on an Internet or Intranet site.
- 24 Sec. 211. In addition to funds appropriated in part 1, the
- 25 department may accept contributions, gifts, bequests, devises, user
- 26 fees, grants, and donations. Funds accepted by the department are
- 27 appropriated and allotted when received and may be expended
- 28 immediately upon receipt or at any later time. Those funds that

- 1 are not expended in the current fiscal year shall not lapse at the
- 2 close of the fiscal year and may be carried over by the library of
- 3 Michigan for expenditure in the following fiscal years.
- 4 Sec. 259. From the funds appropriated in part 1 for information
- 5 technology, the department shall pay user fees to the department of
- 6 information technology for technology related services and
- 7 projects. Such user fees shall be subject to provisions of an
- 8 interagency agreement between the department and the department of
- 9 information technology.
- 10 Sec. 260. Amounts appropriated in part 1 for information
- 11 technology may be designated as work projects and carried forward
- 12 to support technology projects under the direction of the
- 13 department of information technology. Funds designated in this
- 14 manner are not available for expenditure until approved as work
- 15 projects under section 451a of the management and budget act, 1984

17 DEPARTMENT OPERATIONS

- 18 Sec. 301. (1) The appropriations in part 1 may be used for per
- 19 diem payments to the members of commissions, boards, or committees
- 20 for a full day of commission, board, or committee work at which a
- 21 quorum is present, for attending a hearing as authorized by the
- 22 respective commission, board, or committee, or for performing
- 23 official business as authorized by each respective commission,
- 24 board, or committee.
- 25 (2) The per diem payments shall be \$50.00 per day for all
- 26 commissions and boards.

27 COUNCIL FOR THE ARTS AND CULTURAL AFFAIRS

28 Sec. 401. (1) The Michigan council for arts and cultural

- 1 affairs in the department shall administer the arts and cultural
- 2 grants appropriated in part 1. The council shall provide for fair
- 3 and independent decisions on arts and cultural grant requests based
- 4 upon published criteria to evaluate program quality. This criteria
- 5 shall include a prohibition of art projects that include displays
- 6 of human wastes on religious symbols, displays of sex acts, and
- 7 depictions of flag desecration. The council shall seek to award
- 8 grants on an equitable geographic basis to the extent possible
- 9 given the quality of grant applications received. Priority shall
- 10 be given to projects that serve multiple counties and that leverage
- 11 significant additional public and private investment. Counties,
- 12 cities, villages, townships, community foundations, and
- 13 organizations, including science museums/centers, may apply for the
- 14 following categories of grants:
- 15 (a) Anchor organization program for organizations that serve a
- 16 statewide audience. Anchor organizations shall demonstrate a
- 17 commitment to education, to mentoring smaller organizations, and to
- 18 reaching underserved audiences.
- 19 (b) Arts projects program.
- 20 (c) Arts and learning program.
- 21 (d) Artists in schools program.
- (e) Arts organization development program.
- 23 (f) Capital improvement projects.
- 24 (g) Local, regional, or statewide arts agencies services
- 25 program.
- 26 (h) Regional regranting program.
- 27 (i) Partnership program.
- 28 (j) Discretionary grants program.

- 1 (k) Rural arts and cultural projects.
- 2 Sec. 402. The appropriation for arts and cultural grants in
- 3 part 1 and disbursed under section 401 shall, at a minimum, be
- 4 matched on an equal dollar-for-dollar basis from local and private
- 5 contributions paid and received by each awardee receiving grants
- 6 under section 401. The dollar-for-dollar match may include the
- 7 reasonable value of services, materials, and equipment as allowed
- 8 under the federal internal revenue code for charitable
- 9 contributions subject also to the preapproval of such a match by
- 10 the Michigan council for arts and cultural affairs. The council
- 11 shall receive proof of the entire amount of the matching funds,
- 12 services, materials, or equipment by the end of the award period.
- 13 Sec. 403. Before any amount appropriated for arts and cultural
- 14 grants in part 1 may be expended for a grant to eligible applicants
- 15 for the purposes in section 401, the department shall execute a
- 16 grant agreement with each grantee. The grant agreement shall
- 17 specify the criteria included in section 401 with which the
- 18 application complies. The grant agreement shall include a list of
- 19 the projects funded.
- 20 Sec. 404. Counties, cities, villages, townships, community
- 21 foundations, and organizations receiving funds under section 401
- 22 shall provide to the Michigan council for arts and cultural affairs
- 23 a final report covering the grant period within 30 days after the
- 24 end of the grant period indicating at least the following:
- 25 (a) Project revenues and expenditures indicating grant matching
- 26 fund amounts.
- 27 (b) Number of patrons attracted or benefitting during the grant
- 28 period.

- 1 (c) A narrative summary of each project and its outcomes.
- 2 Awardees receiving grants greater than \$100,000.00, shall also
- 3 submit this same report on an interim basis by April 7 of the grant
- 4 year.
- 5 Sec. 405. The applicants for arts and cultural grant funds
- 6 shall be charged a nonrefundable application fee of \$100.00 or 1%
- 7 of the grant, whichever is less. The application fee may be used
- 8 by the department to recover direct and indirect costs as
- 9 appropriated in part 1.
- 10 Sec. 406. It is the intent of the legislature that the Michigan
- 11 council for arts and cultural affairs continue to take appropriate
- 12 steps to ensure that all organizations receiving state arts anchor
- 13 organization grants have combined grant awards, as defined in
- 14 section 408, of no more than 15.0% of operating revenue for the
- 15 fiscal year ending September 30, 2005 and beyond. As used in this
- 16 section, "operating revenue" is defined in the same manner as it
- 17 was defined during the fiscal year 2000 state arts anchor
- 18 organization application process.
- 19 Sec. 407. The council shall continue and expand its efforts to
- 20 encourage and support nonprofit arts and cultural organizations
- 21 transitioning from solely volunteer-based organizations to
- 22 professional directed operations. This includes the provision of
- 23 funds and services from the arts organization development,
- 24 partnership, arts projects, anchor organization and regional
- 25 regranting programs as well as the rural arts and culture
- 26 initiative to support professional development within these
- 27 organizations. Criteria for support include the requirement of
- 28 collaboration between these organizations and other community

- 1 organizations.
- 2 Sec. 408. Any organizations receiving grants within the anchor
- 3 organization program category in excess of 10.0% of their operating
- 4 revenue, as defined in section 406, for the fiscal year ending
- 5 September 30, 2002 shall not receive a combined grant award from
- 6 all grant categories, except the partnership program, that is
- 7 greater than the combined grant award from these categories that
- 8 the organization received for the fiscal year ending September 30,
- **9** 2002.
- 10 Sec. 409. The council shall provide for fair, equitable, and
- 11 efficient distribution of funds granted through the regional
- 12 regranting program. The council shall provide for an annual
- 13 assessment of grant management and distribution of mini-grant
- 14 awards by designated regional regranting agencies and review the
- 15 methodology employed.
- 16 Sec. 410. The council shall make every effort to provide total
- 17 grant awards in the anchor organization program at a level not to
- 18 exceed 65% of the total amount appropriated for arts and cultural
- 19 grants.
- 20 Sec. 411. The department will submit two annual reports to the
- 21 state budget office and the appropriations subcommittees. The
- 22 first report will be due 30 days after the annual grant awards are
- 23 made by the council. The report shall contain:
- 24 (a) A listing of each applicant.
- 25 (b) The county of residence of an applicant.
- 26 (c) The amount awarded.
- 27 (d) The amount requested.
- (e) The grant category under which an applicant applied.

- (f) The expected number of patrons for an applicant during the
 grant period.
- 3 (g) The amount of matching funds proposed by an applicant.
- 4 (h) The review score for each application.
- 5 (i) A listing with the information in items a through c above
- 6 for any regranted funds in the preceding fiscal year.
- 7 The second report will be due when materials are first
- 8 distributed by the council seeking grant applications for the
- 9 following fiscal year. The report shall contain:
- 10 (a) The guidelines by which the council will award grants.
- 11 (b) A summary of any changes in the program guidelines from the
- 12 previous fiscal year.
- (c) A summary of any initiatives the council is taking to
- 14 improve public access to the arts and culture, including the use of
- 15 technology applications.

16 MICHIGAN HISTORICAL PROGRAM

- 17 Sec. 501. The federal funds appropriated in part 1 for the
- 18 historic site preservation grants are for work projects and shall
- 19 not lapse at the end of the fiscal year but shall continue to be
- 20 available for expenditure until the projects for which the funds
- 21 were reserved have been completed or are terminated. The purpose
- 22 of these work projects is the identification, designation, and
- 23 preservation of historic resources. The method used will be to
- 24 solicit applications from eligible recipients, score applications
- 25 based upon established criteria, and award the contracts and
- 26 subgrants. The total cost is \$1,348,000.00 and the tentative
- 27 completion date is September 30, 2003.
- Sec. 502. Funds collected by the department under sections 3,

- 1 6, 7, and 7a of 1913 PA 271, MCL 399.3, 399.6, 399.7, and 399.7a,
- 2 are appropriated to the department for the purpose for which they
- 3 were received and shall not lapse to the general fund at the end of
- 4 the fiscal year.
- 5 Sec. 503. For purposes of administering the museum store as
- 6 provided in section 7a of 1913 PA 271, MCL 399.7a, the department
- 7 is exempt from section 261 of the management and budget act, 1984
- 8 PA 431, MCL 18.1261.
- 9 Sec. 504. (1) From the state funds appropriated in part 1, the
- 10 department may award discretionary historical grants to preserve
- 11 Michigan lighthouses. The department may award up to \$152,700.00
- 12 in grants for this purpose and may use a portion of those funds to
- 13 assist in the transfer of lighthouses from federal ownership. A
- 14 portion of the funds may also be dedicated to program
- 15 administration and project coordination.
- 16 (2) The department shall allocate grant funds pursuant to
- 17 eligibility and scoring requirements established by the department.
- 18 The method used will be to solicit applications from eligible
- 19 recipients, score applications based on the established criteria,
- 20 and award grants through executed contracts.
- 21 (3) Grants may be awarded for purposes of stabilization,
- 22 rehabilitation, or other preservation work on a Michigan
- 23 lighthouse, but shall not be awarded for operational purposes. The
- 24 department shall not allocate a grant that exceeds \$40,000.00.
- 25 (4) The funds appropriated and allocated by this section are
- 26 for work projects. The funds shall not lapse to the general fund
- 27 at the end of the fiscal year but shall remain available in
- 28 subsequent fiscal years, until funds have been expended, the

- 1 projects for which the funds were reserved have been completed, or
- 2 the projects are terminated, whichever occurs first. The tentative
- 3 date for completion is September 30, 2004.
- 4 Sec. 505. From the funds appropriated in part 1 for historical
- 5 administration and services, \$71,200.00 shall be allocated to
- 6 support the operations of the Michigan freedom trail commission as
- 7 specified in section 4 of the Michigan freedom trail commission
- 8 act, 1998 PA 409, MCL 399.84. These funds shall be used to
- 9 reimburse commission members, to pay for necessary contractual
- 10 services of the commission, and to hire not more than 1.0 FTE
- 11 position in the department's Michigan historical center to support
- 12 commission operations.
- 13 Sec. 506. (1) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1,
- 14 the department shall collect an application fee of \$250.00 for each
- 15 application submitted under section 1 of 1955 PA 10, MCL 399.151,
- 16 for property designated as a state historic site.
- 17 (2) The department shall deposit the fees collected under
- 18 subsection (1) in a separate revolving fund. Any revenue remaining
- 19 in the fund at the end of the fiscal year shall not lapse to the
- 20 general fund but shall remain available for future expenditures.
- 21 The department may expend any revenues in the fund immediately upon
- 22 receipt. Expenditures shall be made only for the purpose of
- 23 correcting, repairing, or replacing numbered markers erected
- 24 pursuant to section 2 of 1955 PA 10, MCL 399.152.

25 LIBRARY OF MICHIGAN

- 26 Sec. 651. The appropriation in part 1 to the library of
- 27 Michigan, for subregional state aid, shall not be expended unless
- 28 the local unit of government agrees to not reduce local support

- 1 below the level of local support expended for subregional library
- 2 services in the local unit of government's immediately preceding
- 3 fiscal year. A reduction in local expenditures that equally
- 4 affects all agencies within a local unit of government shall not be
- 5 interpreted as a replacement of local financial or in-kind support
- 6 with state aid funds.
- 7 Sec. 652. The appropriation in part 1 for a subregional
- 8 library, shall not be released until a budget for that subregional
- 9 library has been approved by the department for expenditures for
- 10 library services directly serving the blind and persons with
- 11 disabilities. Subregional state aid shall be used only for
- 12 providing services to the blind and to persons with disabilities.
- Sec. 653. The appropriation in part 1 for statewide database
- 14 access, shall be used only for making computerized databases,
- 15 searches of those databases, and the products of those searches,
- 16 available through the libraries of Michigan. Only those libraries
- 17 that qualify under the federal library services and technology act,
- 18 subtitle B of title II of the museum and library services act,
- 19 Public Law 94-462, 110 Stat. 3009-901, are eligible to participate
- 20 in this project.
- 21 Sec. 654. From the state general fund/general purpose
- 22 appropriation in part 1, there is allocated \$657,100.00 to
- 23 reimburse public libraries as provided by section 12 of the
- 24 Michigan renaissance zone act, 1996 PA 376, MCL 125.2692, for
- 25 property taxes levied in 2002. Reimbursements shall be made in
- 26 amounts to each eligible recipient not later than 60 days after the
- 27 department of treasury certifies to the department that it has
- 28 received all necessary information to properly determine the

- 1 amounts due each eligible recipient under section 12(4) of the
- 2 Michigan renaissance zone act, 1996 PA 376, MCL 125.2692. Any
- 3 excess allocations shall lapse to the general fund.
