# **SENATE BILL No. 1115**

February 13, 2002, Introduced by Senators Hoffman and North and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

## EXECUTIVE BUDGET BILL

A bill to make appropriations for the department of military and veterans affairs for the fiscal years ending September 30, 2002 and September 30, 2003; to provide for the expenditure of the appropriations; to provide for certain powers and duties of the department of military and veterans affairs, other state agencies, and local units of government related to the appropriations; and to provide for the preparation of certain reports related to the appropriations.

28	Sec. 201. Pursuant to section 30 of article IX of the state

- 1 constitution of 1963, total state spending from state resources
- 2 under part 1 for fiscal year 2002-2003 is \$59,893,000.00 and state
- 3 spending from state resources to be paid to local units of
- 4 government for fiscal year 2002-2003 is \$120,000.00. The itemized
- 5 statement below identifies appropriations from which spending to

- 7 DEPARTMENT OF MILITARY AND VETERANS AFFAIRS
- 8 MILITARY TRAINING SITES AND SUPPORT FACILITIES
- 10 MICHIGAN VETERANS' TRUST FUND
- 11 County counselor travel expenses . . . . . . \$ 50,000
- 13 Sec. 202. The appropriations authorized under this bill are
- 14 subject to the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1101
- **15** to 18.1594.
- 16 Sec. 203. As used in this bill:
- (a) "Department" means the department of military and veterans
- 18 affairs.
- (b) "Director" means the director of the department of
- 20 military and veterans affairs.
- 21 (c) "DOD" means the United States department of defense.
- (d) "DOD-DOA-NGB" means the DOD department of the army,
- 23 national quard bureau.
- (e) "DVA" means the United States department of veterans'
- 25 affairs.
- 26 (f) "DVA-VHA" means the DVA veterans' health administration.
- 27 (g) "FTE" means full-time equated.
- (h) "HHS" means the United States department of health and

- 1 human services.
- 2 (i) "HHS-HCFA" means the HHS health care financing
- 3 administration.
- 4 (j) "IDG" means interdepartmental grant.
- 5 Sec. 204. The department of civil service shall bill
- 6 departments and agencies at the end of the first fiscal quarter
- 7 for the 1% charge authorized by section 5 of article XI of the
- 8 state constitution of 1963. Payments shall be made for the total
- 9 amount of the billing by the end of the second fiscal quarter.
- 10 Sec. 205. (1) A hiring freeze is imposed on the state
- 11 classified civil service. State departments and agencies are
- 12 prohibited from hiring any new full-time state classified civil
- 13 service employees and prohibited from filling any vacant state
- 14 classified civil service positions. This hiring freeze does not
- 15 apply to internal transfers of classified employees from one
- 16 position to another within a department.
- 17 (2) The state budget director shall grant exceptions to this
- 18 hiring freeze when the state budget director believes that the
- 19 hiring freeze will result in rendering a state department or
- 20 agency unable to deliver basic services, cause loss of revenue to
- 21 the state, result in the inability of the state to receive federal
- 22 funds, or would necessitate additional expenditures that exceed
- 23 any savings from maintaining a vacancy. The state budget director
- 24 shall report quarterly to the chairpersons of the senate and house
- 25 standing committees on appropriations the number of exceptions to
- 26 the hiring freeze approved during the previous quarter and the
- 27 reasons to justify the exception.
- 28 Sec. 206. (1) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1,

- 1 there is appropriated an amount not to exceed \$5,000,000.00 for
- 2 federal contingency funds. These funds are not available for
- 3 expenditure until they have been transferred to another line item
- 4 in this bill under section 393(2) of the management and budget
- 5 act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1393.
- 6 (2) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1, there is
- 7 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$2,000,000.00 for state
- 8 restricted contingency funds. These funds are not available for
- 9 expenditure until they have been transferred to another line item
- 10 in this bill under section 393(2) of the management and budget
- 11 act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1393.
- 12 (3) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1, there is
- 13 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$100,000.00 for local
- 14 contingency funds. These funds are not available for expenditure
- 15 until they have been transferred to another line item in this bill
- 16 under section 393(2) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA
- **17** 431, MCL 18.1393.
- 18 (4) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1, there is
- 19 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$100,000.00 for private
- 20 contingency funds. These funds are not available for expenditure
- 21 until they have been transferred to another line item in this bill
- 22 under section 393(2) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA
- 23 431, MCL 18.1393.
- 24 Sec. 208. Unless otherwise specified, the department shall use
- 25 the Internet to fulfill the reporting requirements of this bill.
- 26 This may include transmission of reports via electronic mail to
- 27 the recipients identified for each reporting requirement or it may
- 28 include placement of reports on an Internet or Intranet site.

- 1 Sec. 212. (1) Of the funds appropriated in part 1 for military
- 2 training sites and support facilities, there shall be established
- 3 a Michigan national quard education assistance program.
- 4 Disbursements to the educational assistance program shall not
- 5 exceed \$1,300,000.00 without legislative approval. Under the
- 6 program, a member of the national guard who is in active service
- 7 and who enrolls as a full- or part-time student at a public or
- 8 private state college or university may be eligible to receive up
- 9 to an equivalent of 50% of the total cost of tuition not to exceed
- 10 \$2,000.00, as education assistance, in any academic year.
- 11 (2) An eligible person means a member of the Michigan national
- 12 quard who is in active service, as defined in section 105 of the
- 13 Michigan military act, 1967 PA 150, MCL 32.505. An eligible
- 14 person does not include a member of the Michigan national guard or
- 15 air national guard who is absent without leave or who is under
- 16 charges as described in the Michigan code of military justice of
- 17 1980, 1980 PA 523, MCL 32.1001 to 32.1148.
- 18 (3) The department of military and veterans affairs, office of
- 19 the adjutant general shall administer the education assistance
- 20 program and prescribe forms and procedures to effectively carry
- 21 out the education assistance program.
- 22 (4) An eligible person shall apply to the department of
- 23 military and veterans affairs, office of the adjutant general for
- 24 education assistance and shall provide evidence of attendance and
- 25 completion of the course of study with a grade of at least 2.0 on
- 26 a 4.0 scale, or its equivalent. The adjutant general shall
- 27 approve the application for reimbursement if the applicant meets
- 28 the definition of an eligible person under subsection (2) and

- 1 other criteria as established by the adjutant general.
- 2 (5) The education assistance program applies to any course of
- 3 instruction that is included in an associate, undergraduate, or
- 4 postgraduate degree program offered by a college or university of
- 5 this state.
- **6** (6) The education assistance program applies to an eligible
- 7 person notwithstanding any other educational incentive or benefit
- 8 received by the eligible person under any other educational
- 9 assistance program provided by any other state.
- 10 (7) An eligible person who successfully completes the course
- 11 of study with a grade of at least 2.0 on a 4.0 scale, or its
- 12 equivalent, shall be eligible for reimbursement.
- 13 (8) The department of military and veterans affairs may use
- 14 funds from the appropriated funds to administer the education
- 15 assistance program.
- 16 (9) Reimbursed members who do not complete their national
- 17 guard obligation shall pay the state for money received from the
- 18 state for tuition. Members who fail to repay the state within the
- 19 time limits established by the adjutant general shall be indebted
- 20 to the state. The department shall work in conjunction with the
- 21 department of treasury for inclusion in the tax intercept program
- 22 for amounts due the state.
- 23 (10) A portion of the funds for the Michigan national guard
- 24 education assistance program may be used by the department for the
- 25 purpose of promoting the program and for encouraging those persons
- 26 the department wishes to have enlist or reenlist in the Michigan
- 27 national quard.
- 28 Sec. 259. From the funds appropriated in part 1 for

- 1 information technology, the department shall pay user fees to the
- 2 department of information technology for technology related
- 3 services and projects. Such user fees shall be subject to
- 4 provisions of an interagency agreement between the department and
- 5 the department of information technology.
- **6** Sec. 260. Amounts appropriated in part 1 for information
- 7 technology may be designated as work projects and carried forward
- 8 to support technology projects under the direction of the
- 9 department of information technology. Funds designated in this
- 10 manner are not available for expenditure until approved as work
- 11 projects under section 451a of the management and budget act, 1984
- 12 PA 431, MCL 18.1451a.

#### 13 HEADQUARTERS AND ARMORIES

- 14 Sec. 301. The department may charge reasonable rental and
- 15 equipment usage fees for renting an armory or using the distance
- 16 learning network. The fee shall include the cost of overtime
- 17 compensation, insurance coverage, and any maintenance required.
- 18 Sec. 302. (1) The funds appropriated in this bill for private
- 19 donations to the challenge program shall be considered state
- 20 restricted revenue, and unexpended funds remaining at the close of
- 21 the fiscal year shall not lapse to the general fund but shall be
- 22 carried forward to the subsequent fiscal year.
- 23 (2) The department may charge a parent or guardian of a
- 24 participant in the challenge program an amount not to exceed the
- 25 per student state share cost of administering the program based on
- 26 a demonstrated ability to pay. A parent shall be notified of any
- 27 charge to be assessed under this subsection prior to enrollment of
- 28 the child in the program.

- 1 Sec. 304. The department will partner with the family
- 2 independence agency to identify youth who may be eligible for the
- 3 challenge program from those youth served by family independence
- 4 agency programs. Such eligible youth shall be given priority for
- 5 enrollment in the program.

### 6 VETERANS SERVICE ORGANIZATIONS

- 7 Sec. 501. (1) Money appropriated in part 1 for grants to
- 8 veterans service organizations shall be used only for salaries,
- 9 wages, related personnel costs, training, and equipment for
- 10 accredited veteran service advocacy officers and necessary support
- 11 and managerial staff. Training shall be provided for service
- 12 advocacy officers and shall be conducted by accredited advocacy
- 13 officers.
- 14 (2) To receive a grant from the money appropriated in part 1,
- 15 a veterans service organization shall meet the following
- 16 eligibility requirements:
- 17 (a) Be congressionally chartered by the United States
- 18 Congress.
- 19 (b) Be an active participating member of the Michigan veterans
- 20 organizations' rehabilitation and veterans service committee and
- 21 abide by its rules, guidelines, and programs.
- (c) Demonstrate the receipt of monetary or service support
- 23 from its own organization.
- 24 (d) Comply with the department's and the legislature's
- 25 requirements of accounting audits, service work activity,
- 26 accounting of recoveries, listing of volunteer hours, budget
- 27 requests, and other requirements specified in subsection (3).
- 28 (e) For a veterans service organization founded after

- 1 September 30, 1989, be in operation and providing service to
- 2 Michigan veterans for not less than 2 years before receiving an
- 3 initial state grant. During this 2-year period of time, the
- 4 organization shall file a listing of service work activity and an
- 5 accounting of recoveries with the department, the senate and house
- 6 fiscal agencies, the senate and house of representatives
- 7 subcommittees on military affairs, and the state budget office on
- 8 forms as prescribed by the department.
- 9 (3) A veterans service organization receiving a grant from the
- 10 money appropriated in part 1 shall file with the department an
- 11 accounting of its expenditures, audited and certified by a
- 12 certified public accountant, within 120 days after the
- 13 organization's fiscal year end. Each organization shall provide a
- 14 detailed budget request for the fiscal year ending September 30,
- 15 2004, to the department by November 15, 2002, within the format as
- 16 prescribed by the department to be used in the development of the
- 17 budget for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2004. Each
- 18 veterans service organization shall provide 5 copies of a listing
- 19 of all service activity, an accounting of recoveries, and a
- 20 listing of volunteer hours for the fiscal year ending September
- 21 30, 2002, to the department by January 31, 2003. The listing of
- 22 volunteer hours shall include the hours, services, and donations
- 23 provided to residents of the Grand Rapids veterans' home and the
- 24 D.J. Jacobetti veterans' home. Each veterans service organization
- 25 shall provide a copy of the most recent and completed internal
- 26 revenue service form 990 to the department at the end of the
- 27 fiscal year ending September 30, 2002. A veterans service
- 28 organization receiving a grant from the money appropriated in part

- 1 1 shall use the forms recommended by the Michigan veterans
- 2 organizations' rehabilitation and veterans service committee for
- 3 filing reports required by this bill. The department shall
- 4 forward information required under this section to the senate and
- 5 house fiscal agencies, the senate and house of representatives
- 6 appropriations subcommittees on military affairs, and the state
- 7 budget director.

# 8 <u>VETERANS' HOMES</u>

- 9 Sec. 601. Appropriations in this bill for the Grand Rapids
- 10 veterans' home and the D.J. Jacobetti veterans' home shall not be
- 11 used for any purpose other than for veterans and veterans'
- 12 families.
- 13 Sec. 603. The money appropriated in this bill for the boards
- 14 of managers may be expended for facility improvements, the
- 15 purchase and repair of equipment and furnishings, member services,
- 16 and other purposes that benefit the Grand Rapids veterans' home
- 17 and the D.J. Jacobetti veterans' home.

## 18 VETERANS' TRUST FUND

- 19 Sec. 703. (1) By April 1, 2003, the department shall submit to
- 20 the senate and house of representatives appropriations
- 21 subcommittees on military affairs and the state budget office a
- 22 detailed annual report of the Michigan veterans' trust fund for
- 23 fiscal year 2001-2002. The report shall include information on
- 24 grants provided from the emergency grant program and the veterans
- 25 survivor tuition program, including details concerning the
- 26 methodology of allocations, the selection of emergency grant
- 27 program authorized agents, and a detailed breakdown of trust fund
- 28 expenditures for that year. The report shall also provide an

- 1 update on the department's efforts to reduce program
- 2 administrative costs.
- 3 (2) The annual report required under subsection (1) shall
- 4 contain information on the veterans survivors tuition program,
- 5 including the number of participants, where the participants
- 6 attended school, payments made to each school, the average grade
- 7 point and number of college credits earned by each participant,
- 8 the number of participants suspended by the program, and the
- 9 number of participants who earned a degree during fiscal year
- **10** 2001-2002.
