THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 16261. (1) A person AN INDIVIDUAL who is not
- 2 licensed or registered under this article shall not use an insig-
- 3 nia, title, or letter, or a word, letter, or phrase singly or in
- 4 combination, with or without qualifying words, letters, or
- 5 phrases, under a circumstance to induce the belief that the
- 6 person is licensed or registered in this state, is lawfully enti-
- 7 tled in this state to engage in the practice of a HEALTH profes-
- 8 sion regulated by this article, or is otherwise in compliance

- 1 (2) An individual shall not announce or hold himself or
- 2 herself out to the public as limiting his or her practice to, as
- 3 being specially qualified in, or as giving particular attention

- 17 Sec. 16411. A person AN INDIVIDUAL shall not engage in
- 18 the practice of chiropractic, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, PER-
- 19 FORMING A CHIROPRACTIC ADJUSTMENT, CHIROPRACTIC MANIPULATION, OR
- 20 OTHER CHIROPRACTIC SERVICES OR CHIROPRACTIC OPINION, unless
- 21 licensed or otherwise authorized by AS A CHIROPRACTOR UNDER
- 22 this article.
