Pursuant to the requirements of the Constitution, the Representatives assembled in Representative Hall in the Capitol at Lansing on the second Wednesday in January, the 9th of January, 2002 at 12:00 o'clock Noon, and in accordance with law, were called to order by the Honorable Rick Johnson, Speaker of the House of Representatives.

Rep. Larry DeVuyst, from the 93rd District, offered the following invocation:

House Resolution No. 295.

A resolution honoring the University of Michigan field hockey team upon the occasion of winning the 2001 NCAA Division I Field Hockey Championship to become the 2001 NCAA champions.

Whereas, The University of Michigan field hockey team compiled an overall record of 18-5 in the 2001 season. They were ranked among the nation's top five during the 2001 season. The University of Michigan finished the season in third place in the Big Ten Conference, finished third in the Big Ten Tournament, and received an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament; and

Whereas, The University of Michigan secured their presence as a national powerhouse by defeating the University of North Carolina and Michigan State University in the NCAA Regional Tournament. They played in the NCAA Final Four in Kent, Ohio, and then went on to defeat Princeton and Maryland to win the NCAA championship; and
