## **Transmittal of Administrative Rules**

**Analysis** Summary

Senate Bill 800, as passed by the Senate, would amend 1969 PA 306, the Administrative Procedures Act, to authorize the electronic transmission of administrative rules and notices of proposed guidelines. The bill would define "notice" to mean a written or electronic record that informs a person of past or future action, and would define "record" to mean information that is inscribed on a paper or electronic medium. The bill would require that only electronic notices be given to members or agencies of the Legislative and Executive branches of state government. Also, the bill would require that submission of proposed rules be in the form of four paper copies and electronic submission to the Legislative Service Bureau for formal certification.

**Fiscal Impact** 

The electronic submission of rules and notices would result in a minimal amount of savings to the state, perhaps between \$2,000 and \$5,000. Any savings resulting from the bill would help to offset reductions taken in the FY 2004 Legislative Council budget.
