**Analysis** Summary

House Bill 4172 amends Part 51 of the Public Health Code, the General Provisions of Article 5 Prevention and Control of Diseases and Disabilities, to provide that a convicted individual may be ordered by the court to pay the costs of testing or examination ordered under Section 5129, for sexually transmitted disease, Hepatitis B infection, AIDS, HIV, or an antibody to HIV. If the costs are not paid within 30 days or within the period provided by the court, the individual is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by not more than 90 days imprisonment or a fine of not more than \$100, or both.

## **Fiscal Impact**

The bill has state and local government fiscal implications. The bill may provide savings for any testing and examination costs that are currently paid for by the state or by local governments. Any additional imprisonment costs for individuals as a result of the bill will be an increase in costs to local correctional systems, which vary on a per diem basis from county to county. Additional revenue from fines from individuals as a result of the bill will be revenue to local libraries in accordance with the Constitution of the State of Michigan, Article VIII, Section 9.
