House Bill 4286 would create a new act that would designate the ruffed

grouse (bonasa umbellus) as Michigan's official game bird.

Fiscal Impact

The fiscal impact on State and local units of government by this bill is indeterminate. It could be assumed that by designating a state game bird that people's awareness of the bird and the opportunities to hunt them or observe them in their habitat may increase. Increased interest in hunting or birding

may have a positive fiscal impact on State or local revenues.
