Analysis Summary

HB 5022 would amend Public Act 33 of 1951, which provides police and fire protection for townships, certain incorporated villages, and cities under 15,000 population, to create a new provision that the members of a police administrative board, a fire administrative board, or a police and fire administrative board, may be compensated a per diem as determined by the township board and also be entitled to actual and necessary expenses approved by the township board incurred in the performance of official duties. Under the current law, the members serve without compensation and are entitled to actual and necessary expenses only.

Fiscal Impact

HB 5022 would increase local cost, which would depend on the indeterminate amount of per diem compensation to 5 members of the board and the number of townships that would pay these compensations.
