Analysis Summary

This package of bills, all of which are tie-barred to each other, would amend the Single Business Tax Act by eliminating from the tax base any health care costs paid by taxpayers. Each of the five bills would reduce the health care component of the tax base by one-fifth so that after five years health care costs would be completely eliminated.

Fiscal Impact

Because the health care component is being phased out over a five year period, the full impact will not be felt until tax years that begin after December 31, 2007. Incrementally, the revenue reductions are estimated to be:
