<b>Analysis</b>	<p><b>Summary</b></p> <p>Under the Revised School Code, a student of a public or nonpublic school may possess and use a metered dose inhaler or a dry powder inhaler to alleviate or prevent the onset of asthmatic symptoms while in school, on school-sponsored transportation, or at any activity sponsored by or in which the student's school is participating, provided certain conditions are met. The bill would also permit a student to possess and use an epinephrine auto-injector or epinephrine inhaler to treat anaphylaxis.</p>
