S.B. 681: COMMITTEE SUMMARY

Senate Bill 681 (as introduced 9-16-03) Sponsor: Senator Deborah Cherry

CONTENT

The bill would amend the Code of Criminal Procedure to allow a magistrate, on motion of either party, to permit an expert witness's testimony in a preliminary examination to be conducted by video conferencing.

(Under the Code, "magistrate" means a judge of the district court or a judge of a municipal court, but does not include a district court magistrate, although a district court magistrate may exercise the powers, jurisdiction, and duties of a magistrate if specifically provided by law. The Code states that this definition does not limit the power of a Supreme Court Justice, a circuit judge, or a judge of a court of record having jurisdiction of criminal cases, or deprive him or her of the power to exercise the authority of a magistrate.)
