## SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 650

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

by amending section 17766c (MCL 333.17766c), as added by 1994 PA 38.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 17766c. (1) A person shall not possess more than  $\frac{10}{10}$
- 2 12 grams of ephedrine or pseudoephedrine alone or in a mixture.
- 3 (2) A person who violates this section is guilty of a felony
- 4 punishable by imprisonment for not more than 2 years or a fine of
- 5 not more than \$2,000.00, or both.
- 6 (3) This section does not apply to any of the following:
- 7 (a) A person who possesses ephedrine or pseudoephedrine
- 8 pursuant to a license issued by this state or the United States
- 9 to manufacture, deliver, dispense, possess with intent to
- 10 manufacture or deliver, or possess a controlled substance,

- 2 (b) An individual who possesses ephedrine or pseudoephedrine

- (e) A person who, in the course of his or her business,
- 14 stores ephedrine or pseudoephedrine for sale or distribution to a
- 15 person described in subdivision (a), (c), or (d).
- (f) Any product that the state board of pharmacy, upon
- 17 application of a manufacturer, exempts from this section because
- 18 the product has been formulated in such a way as to effectively
- 19 prevent the conversion of the active ingredient into
- 20 methamphetamine.
- 21 (g) Possession of any pediatric product primarily intended
- 22 for administration to children under 12 years of age according to
- 23 label instructions.
