## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 539k. (1) A person who is not a party to a transaction
- 2 that involves the use of a financial transaction device shall not
- 3 secretly or surreptitiously photograph, <<or otherwise capture or record,
- 4 electronically or by any other means, or distribute, disseminate, or transmit, electronically or by any other means, >> personal identifying
- information from the transaction without the consent of the
- 6 individual.
  - (2) This section does not prohibit the capture or
  - transmission of personal identifying information in the ordinary and lawful course of business.
  - <<(3) This section does not apply to a peace officer of this state, or of the federal government, or the officer's agent, while in the lawful performance of the officer's duties.
  - (4) This section does not prohibit a person from being charged with, convicted of, or punished for any other violation of law committed by that person while violating or attempting to violate this section.>>
- 10 <<(5)>> A person who violates this section is guilty of a 11 misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than 1 year
