## HOUSE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 160

A bill to provide for the audit and examination of this state and state funds; to provide for the audit and examination of the books and accounts of all branches, departments, offices, boards, commissions, agencies, authorities, and institutions of this state; to prescribe powers and duties of certain state officers and employees; to provide for access to certain records; to provide for the subpoena of witnesses and production of documents and records; to prescribe penalties; and to provide for the administration of this act.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. (1) The auditor general shall conduct audits and
- 2 examinations of all branches, departments, offices, boards,
- 3 commissions, agencies, authorities, and institutions of this
- 4 state.
- 5 (2) In connection with the audits and examinations described

- 1 in this act, the auditor general may examine, or cause to be
- 2 examined, the books, accounts, documents, records, performance
- 3 activities, and financial affairs of each branch, department,
- 4 office, board, commission, agency, authority, and institution of
- 5 this state.
- **6** (3) Upon demand of the auditor general, deputy auditor
- 7 general, or any person appointed by the auditor general to make
- 8 the audits and examinations provided in this act, the officers
- 9 and employees of all branches, departments, offices, boards,
- 10 commissions, agencies, authorities, and institutions of this
- 11 state shall produce for examination all books, accounts,
- 12 documents, and records of their respective branch, department,
- 13 office, board, commission, agency, authority, and institution and
- 14 truthfully answer all questions relating to their books,
- 15 accounts, documents, and records of their respective activities
- 16 and affairs.
- 17 (4) In connection with audits and examinations described in
- 18 this act, the auditor general, deputy auditor general, or any
- 19 person appointed to make audits and examinations may issue
- 20 subpoenas, direct the service of the subpoena by any police
- 21 officer, and compel the attendance and testimony of witnesses;
- 22 may administer oaths and examine any person as may be necessary;
- 23 and may compel the production of books, accounts, papers,
- 24 documents, and records. The orders and subpoenas issued by the
- 25 auditor general, deputy auditor general, or any person appointed
- 26 with the duty of making the examinations provided in this
- 27 subsection may be enforced upon application to any circuit court

- 1 as provided by law.
- 2 (5) The auditor general may employ and compensate auditors,
- 3 examiners, and assistants as he or she considers necessary. In
- 4 addition, the auditors, examiners, and assistants shall be paid
- 5 their necessary traveling expenses while engaging in the duties
- 6 provided under this act. Compensation and expenses shall be paid
- 7 out of the funds appropriated for that purpose. The auditor
- 8 general and the deputy auditor general shall receive their actual
- 9 traveling expenses incurred while engaging in the duties provided
- 10 under this act, which shall be paid out of the funds appropriated
- 11 for that purpose.
- 12 (6) Any person who gives or offers to any examiner,
- 13 accountant, clerk, or other employee of the auditor general, any
- 14 money, gift, emolument, or thing of value for the purpose of
- 15 influencing the action of the examiner or other employee, in any
- 16 matter relating to the examination of any public account
- 17 authorized by this act, or for the purpose of preventing or
- 18 delaying the examination of any public account, or for the
- 19 purpose of influencing the action of the examiner or other
- 20 employee, in framing, changing, withholding, or delaying any
- 21 report of any examination of any public account, is guilty of a
- 22 misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of not more than \$1,000.00 nor
- 23 less than \$200.00, or imprisonment for not more than 6 months and
- 24 not less than 30 days, or both.
- 25 (7) Any person appointed by the auditor general to make the
- 26 examinations provided for under this act, or any officer, clerk,
- 27 or other employee of the auditor general, who receives or

- 1 solicits any money, gift, emolument, or anything of value for the
- 2 purpose of being influenced in the matter of the examination of
- 3 any public account authorized by this act, or for the purpose of
- 4 being influenced to prevent or delay the examination of any
- 5 public account, is guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine
- 6 of not more than \$1,000.00 and not less than \$200.00, or
- 7 imprisonment for not more than 6 months and not less than 30
- 8 days, or both.
- 9 (8) As used in this act:
- 10 (a) "Audit" means a post audit of financial transactions and
- 11 accounts or performance audit as described in section 53 of
- 12 article IV of the state constitution of 1963.
- 13 (b) "Auditor general" means the individual appointed auditor
- 14 general under section 53 of article IV of the state constitution
- **15** of 1963.
- 16 (c) "Examination" means an inquiry, compilation, or review
- 17 within the scope of the auditor general's authority under section
- 18 53 of article IV of the state constitution of 1963.
