December 4, 2003, Introduced by Reps. Hoogendyk, Sheen, Brandenburg, Voorhees, Drolet, Bradstreet, Vander Veen, Mortimer, Middaugh, Stahl, Ward, Pastor and Casperson and referred to the Committee on Higher Education.

A joint resolution proposing an amendment to the state constitution of 1963, by amending sections 4, 5, and 6 of article VIII, to require per capita funding and provide for legislative oversight of institutions of higher education.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the state of Michigan, That the following amendment to the state constitution of 1963, to require per capita funding and provide for legislative oversight of institutions of higher education, is proposed, agreed to, and submitted to the people of the state:

ARTICLE VIII

- Sec. 4. The legislature shall appropriate moneys equitably

- Resolved further, That the foregoing amendment shall be
- 14 submitted to the people of the state at the next general election
- 15 in the manner provided by law.
