PROHIBIT RELEASE OF INFORMATION ON ACCIDENTS INVOLVING PUBLIC HIGHWAY AUTHORITY WORKERS

A SUMMARY OF HOUSE BILL 4889 AS REPORTED FROM COMMITTEE 12-13-05

The bill would amend the Michigan Vehicle Code. Currently, the code prohibits the Department of Transportation from releasing information to a nongovernmental agency about an accident on the record of a police officer, fire fighter, or a person authorized to operate an ambulance or other emergency vehicle <u>if</u> the accident occurred while the person was operating the vehicle in the course of employment.

House Bill 4889 would add to the list: an employee of the state transportation department, a county road commission, or a local authority with jurisdiction over a highway if the employee is authorized to operate a motor vehicle or equipment while working within the highway right-of-way.

The bill would also specify that this prohibition on releasing information would not apply to any of the drivers listed above if the person was convicted on a crime in connection with the accident.
