A SUMMARY OF HOUSE BILL 5301-5310 AS INTRODUCED 10-18-05

A number of acts award scholarships and grants to Michigan residents. Some require a recipient to be a United States citizen or "permanent resident" of the United States. Others have no citizenship requirement. The bills would amend ten of these acts to require that a recipient be:

A United States citizen or an alien lawfully admitted for permanent residence into the United States.

House Bill 5301 would amend the Michigan Nursing Scholarship Act (MCL 390.1184).

<u>House Bill 5302</u> would amend Public Act 102 of 1986, dealing with grants for part-time, independent students.

<u>House Bill 5303</u> would amend Public Act 208 of 1964 (MCL 390.974), addressing state competitive scholarships.

<u>House Bill 5304</u> would amend Public Act 303 of 1986 (MCL 390.1324), dealing with work-study programs for students in graduate and professional programs.

<u>House Bill 5305</u> would amend Public Act 288 of 1986 (MCL 390.1374), which is concerned with work-study programs for students at postsecondary institutions.

<u>House Bill 5306</u> would amend Public Act 273 of 1986 (MCL 390.1404), dealing with educational opportunity grants.

<u>House Bill 5307</u> would amend Public Act 313 of 1966, which provides for tuition grants to resident students attending independent nonprofit postsecondary institutions.

<u>House Bill 5308</u> would amend Public 105 of 1978, under which grants are provided to students at independent nonprofit postsecondary institutions.

<u>House Bill 5309</u> would amend the Legislative Merit Award Program Act (MCL 390.1304).

<u>House Bill 5310</u> would amend the Michigan Merit Award Scholarship Act (MCL 390.1457b).

FISCAL IMPACT:

Because the Merit Award Program is the only major state financial aid program that does not currently have a citizenship requirement, these bills would have a minimal fiscal impact on state expenditures.
