## HOUSE BILL NO. 4226

## A bill to amend 1978 PA 472, entitled

"An act to regulate political activity; to regulate lobbyists, lobbyist agents, and lobbying activities; to require registration of lobbyists and lobbyist agents; to require the filing of reports; to prescribe the powers and duties of the department of state; to prescribe penalties; and to repeal certain acts and parts of acts,"

by amending section 6a (MCL 4.416a), as added by 1994 PA 383.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 6a. (1) A FORMER MEMBER OF THE MICHIGAN SENATE OR HOUSE
- 2 OF REPRESENTATIVES OR A FORMER GOVERNOR, LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR,
- 3 ATTORNEY GENERAL, OR SECRETARY OF STATE SHALL NOT MAKE EXPENDITURES
- 4 FOR OR RECEIVE COMPENSATION FOR LOBBYING THAT IS EQUAL TO OR
- 5 EXCEEDS THE MONETARY THRESHOLD REQUIRED FOR REGISTERING AS A
- 6 LOBBYIST AGENT FOR 1 YEAR IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING THE END OF THE TERM
- 7 OF OFFICE TO WHICH HE OR SHE WAS ELECTED.
- 8 (2) A PERSON WHO HOLDS A NONELECTIVE POSITION OF HEAD OF A

- 3 THAT IS EQUAL TO OR EXCEEDS THE MONETARY THRESHOLD REQUIRED FOR
- 4 REGISTERING AS A LOBBYIST AGENT FOR 1 YEAR AFTER LEAVING THAT

- 6 (3) -(1) A IN ADDITION TO THE RESTRICTION IN SUBSECTION (1),
- 7 A member of the Michigan senate or house of representatives OR A
- 8 GOVERNOR, LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR, ATTORNEY GENERAL, OR SECRETARY OF
- 9 STATE who resigns from office shall not make expenditures for or
- 10 receive compensation or reimbursement for actual expenses for
- 11 lobbying for the remainder of the term of office from which the
- 12 person resigned.
- 13 (4) -(2) A person who violates this section is guilty of a
- 14 misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than \$1,000.00 or by
- 15 imprisonment for not more than 90 days, or both.
