

HOUSE BILL No. 5492

December 8, 2005, Introduced by Reps. Elsenheimer, Jones, Stakoe, Hansen and David Law and referred to the Committee on Health Policy.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code," by amending section 7457 (MCL 333.7457), as added by 1988 PA 139.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 7457. Sections 7451 to 7455 do not apply to any of the
2 following:

3 (a) An object sold or offered for sale to a person licensed

1 (b) An object sold or offered for sale to any hospital,
2 sanitarium, clinical laboratory, or other health care institution
3 including a penal, correctional, or juvenile detention facility for
4 use in that institution.

5 (c) An object sold or offered for sale to a dealer in medical,
6 dental, surgical, or pharmaceutical supplies.

7 ~~[(d) Equipment, a product, or material which may be
8 used in the preparation or smoking of tobacco or
9 smoking herbs other than a controlled substance.]~~

10 ~~[(D)(e)]~~ A blender, bowl, container, spoon, or mixing device not
11 specifically designed for a use described in section 7451.

12 ~~[(E)(f)]~~ A hypodermic syringe or needle sold or offered for sale
13 for the purpose of injecting or otherwise treating livestock or
14 other animals.

15 ~~[(F)(g)]~~ An object sold, offered for sale, or given away by a state
16 or local governmental agency or by a person specifically authorized
17 by a state or local governmental agency to prevent the transmission
18 of infectious agents.

[Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days after
the date it is enacted.]
