SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 5818

A bill to amend 1980 PA 87, entitled "The uniform condemnation procedures act," by amending section 16 (MCL 213.66), as amended by 1996 PA 474.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 16. (1) Except as provided in this section, an ordinary
- 2 or expert witness in a proceeding under this act shall receive from
- 3 the agency the reasonable fees and compensation provided by law for
- 4 similar services in ordinary civil actions in circuit court,
- 5 including the reasonable expenses for preparation and trial.
- **6** (2) If the property owner, by motion to review necessity or
- 7 otherwise, successfully challenges the agency's right to acquire
- 8 the property, or the legal sufficiency of the proceedings, and the

- 1 court finds the proposed acquisition improper, the court shall
- 2 order the agency to reimburse the owner for actual reasonable
- 3 attorney fees and other expenses incurred in defending against the
- 4 improper acquisition.
- 5 (3) If the amount finally determined to be just compensation
- 6 for the property acquired exceeds the amount of the good faith
- 7 written offer under section 5, the court shall order reimbursement
- 8 in whole or in part to the owner by the agency of the owner's
- 9 reasonable attorney's fees, but not in excess of 1/3 of the amount
- 10 by which the ultimate award exceeds the agency's written offer as
- 11 defined by section 5. The reasonableness of the owner's attorney
- 12 fees shall be determined by the court. If the agency or owner is
- 13 ordered to pay attorney fees as sanctions under <u>Michigan court</u>
- 14 rule MCR 2.403 or 2.405, those attorney fee sanctions shall be
- 15 paid to the court as court costs and shall not be paid to the
- 16 opposing party unless the parties agree otherwise.
- 17 (4) If the agency settles a case before entry of a verdict or
- 18 judgment, it may stipulate to pay reasonable attorney and expert
- 19 witness fees.
- 20 (5) Expert witness fees provided for in subsection (1) and
- 21 this subsection THIS SECTION shall be allowed with respect to an
- 22 expert whose services were reasonably necessary to allow the owner
- 23 to prepare for trial. For the purpose of -subsection (1) and this
- 24 subsection THIS SECTION, for each element of compensation, each
- 25 party is limited to 1 expert witness to testify on that element of
- 26 compensation unless, upon showing of good cause, the court permits
- 27 additional experts. The agency's liability for expert witness fees

- shall not be diminished or affected by the failure of the owner to 1
- 2 call an expert as a witness if the failure is caused by settlement
- 3 or other disposition of the case or issue with which the expert is
- 4 concerned.
- 5 (6) —An— EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (7), AN agency
- 6 shall IS not be required to reimburse attorney or expert witness
- fees -that are- attributable to an unsuccessful challenge to 7
- necessity or to the validity of the proceedings. 8
- (7) IN ANY MATTER UNDER THIS ACT INVOLVING THE RELOCATION OF 9
- AN INDIGENT PERSON, OTHER THAN A PROCEEDING CONCERNING THE TAKING 10
- 11 OF PROPERTY FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A HIGHWAY, THE COURT MAY AWARD
- 12 REASONABLE ATTORNEY OR EXPERT WITNESS FEES ATTRIBUTABLE TO AN
- UNSUCCESSFUL CHALLENGE TO NECESSITY OR TO THE VALIDITY OF THE 13
- PROCEEDINGS IF THE COURT FINDS THAT THE INDIGENT PERSON HAD A 14
- REASONABLE AND GOOD FAITH CLAIM THAT THE PROPERTY WAS NOT BEING 15
- TAKEN FOR A PUBLIC USE. AS USED IN THIS SUBSECTION, "INDIGENT 16
- PERSON" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL WHOSE ANNUAL INCOME IS AT OR BELOW 200% 17
- OF THE FEDERAL POVERTY GUIDELINES PUBLISHED BY THE UNITED STATES 18
- 19 DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES.
