## **HOUSE BILL No. 6377**

August 30, 2006, Introduced by Reps. Mortimer, Emmons, Moore, Farhat and Nitz and referred to the Committee on Higher Education and Career Preparation.

A bill to amend 1979 PA 94, entitled

"The state school aid act of 1979,"

**HOUSE BILL No. 6377** 

by amending section 107 (MCL 388.1707), as amended by 2005 PA 155.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 107. (1) From the appropriation in section 11, there is
- $\mathbf{2}$  allocated an amount not to exceed \$21,000,000.00 for 2005-2006 for
- 3 adult education programs authorized under this section.
- 4 (2) To be eligible to be a participant funded under this
- 5 section, a person shall be enrolled in an adult basic education
- 6 program, an adult English as a second language program, a general
- 7 educational development (G.E.D.) test preparation program, a job or
  - employment related program, or a high school completion program,

- 1 that meets the requirements of this section, and shall meet either
- 2 of the following, as applicable:
- 3 (a) If the individual has obtained a high school diploma or a
- 4 general educational development (G.E.D.) certificate, the
- 5 individual meets 1 of the following:
- 6 (i) Is less than 20 years of age on September 1 of the school
- 7 year and is enrolled in the state technical institute and
- 8 rehabilitation center.
- 9 (ii) Is less than 20 years of age on September 1 of the school
- 10 year, is not attending an institution of higher education, and is
- 11 enrolled in a job or employment-related program through a referral
- 12 by an employer.
- 13 (iii) Is enrolled in an English as a second language program.
- 14 (iv) Is enrolled in a high school completion program.
- 15 (b) If the individual has not obtained a high school diploma
- 16 or G.E.D. certificate, the individual meets 1 of the following:
- 17 (i) Is at least 20 years of age on September 1 of the school
- **18** year.
- 19 (ii) Is at least 16 years of age on September 1 of the school
- 20 year, has been permanently expelled from school under section
- 21 1311(2) or 1311a of the revised school code, MCL 380.1311 and
- 22 380.1311a, and has no appropriate alternative education program
- 23 available through his or her district of residence.
- 24 (3) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (4), the amount
- 25 allocated under subsection (1) shall be distributed as follows:
- 26 (a) For districts and consortia that received payments for
- 27 2003-2004 under this section, the amount allocated to each for

- 1 2005-2006 shall be based on the number of participants served by
- 2 the district or consortium for 2005-2006, using the amount
- 3 allocated per full-time equated participant under subsection (5),
- 4 up to a maximum total allocation under this section in an amount
- 5 equal to the amount the district or consortium received for 2003-
- 6 2004 under this section before any reallocations made for 2003-2004
- 7 under subsection (4).
- 8 (b) A district or consortium that received funding in 2003-
- 9 2004 under this section may operate independently of a consortium
- 10 or join or form a consortium for 2005-2006. In addition, a district
- 11 that had a declaration of financial emergency in place under the
- 12 local government fiscal responsibility act, 1990 PA 72, MCL
- 13 141.1201 to 141.1291, and for which that declaration was revoked
- 14 during 2005 may operate a program under this section independently
- 15 of a consortium or may join or form a consortium to operate a
- 16 program under this section. The allocation for 2005-2006 to the
- 17 district or the newly formed consortium under this subsection shall
- 18 be determined by the department -of labor and economic growth and
- 19 shall be based on the proportion of the amounts that are
- 20 attributable to the district or consortium that received funding in
- 21 2003-2004 or, for a district for which a declaration of financial
- 22 emergency was revoked during 2005, based on the amount the district
- 23 received under this section using a 3-year average of the 3 most
- 24 recent fiscal years the district received funding under this
- 25 section. A district or consortium described in this subdivision
- 26 shall notify the department of labor and economic growth of its
- 27 intention with regard to 2005-2006 by October 1, 2005.

- 1 (4) A district that operated an adult education program in
- 2 2004-2005 and does not intend to operate a program in 2005-2006
- 3 shall notify the department -of labor and economic growth- by
- 4 October 1, 2005 of its intention. The funds intended to be
- 5 allocated under this section to a district that does not operate a
- 6 program in 2005-2006 and the unspent funds originally allocated
- 7 under this section to a district or consortium that subsequently
- 8 operates a program at less than the level of funding allocated
- 9 under subsection (3) shall instead be proportionately reallocated
- 10 to the other districts described in subsection (3)(a) that are
- 11 operating an adult education program in 2005-2006 under this
- 12 section.
- 13 (5) The amount allocated under this section per full-time
- 14 equated participant is \$2,850.00 for a 450-hour program. The amount
- 15 shall be proportionately reduced for a program offering less than
- 16 450 hours of instruction.
- 17 (6) An adult basic education program or an adult English as a
- 18 second language program operated on a year-round or school year
- 19 basis may be funded under this section, subject to all of the
- 20 following:
- 21 (a) The program enrolls adults who are determined by an
- 22 appropriate assessment to be below ninth grade level in reading or
- 23 mathematics, or both, or to lack basic English proficiency.
- 24 (b) The program tests individuals for eligibility under
- 25 subdivision (a) before enrollment and tests participants to
- 26 determine progress after every 90 hours of attendance, using
- 27 assessment instruments approved by the department. -of labor and

- 1 economic growth.
- 2 (c) A participant in an adult basic education program is
- 3 eligible for reimbursement until 1 of the following occurs:
- 4 (i) The participant's reading and mathematics proficiency are
- 5 assessed at or above the ninth grade level.
- 6 (ii) The participant fails to show progress on 2 successive
- 7 assessments after having completed at least 450 hours of
- 8 instruction.
- 9 (d) A funding recipient enrolling a participant in an English
- 10 as a second language program is eligible for funding according to
- 11 subsection (10) until the participant meets 1 of the following:
- 12 (i) The participant is assessed as having attained basic
- 13 English proficiency.
- 14 (ii) The participant fails to show progress on 2 successive
- 15 assessments after having completed at least 450 hours of
- 16 instruction. The department -of labor and economic growth shall
- 17 provide information to a funding recipient regarding appropriate
- 18 assessment instruments for this program.
- 19 (7) A general educational development (G.E.D.) test
- 20 preparation program operated on a year-round or school year basis
- 21 may be funded under this section, subject to all of the following:
- 22 (a) The program enrolls adults who do not have a high school
- 23 diploma.
- 24 (b) The program shall administer a G.E.D. pre-test approved by
- 25 the department -of labor and economic growth- before enrolling an
- 26 individual to determine the individual's potential for success on
- 27 the G.E.D. test, and shall administer other tests after every 90

- 1 hours of attendance to determine a participant's readiness to take
- 2 the G.E.D. test.
- 3 (c) A funding recipient shall receive funding according to
- 4 subsection (10) for a participant, and a participant may be
- 5 enrolled in the program until 1 of the following occurs:
- 6 (i) The participant passes the G.E.D. test.
- 7 (ii) The participant fails to show progress on 2 successive
- 8 tests used to determine readiness to take the G.E.D. test after
- 9 having completed at least 450 hours of instruction.
- 10 (8) A high school completion program operated on a year-round
- 11 or school year basis may be funded under this section, subject to
- 12 all of the following:
- 13 (a) The program enrolls adults who do not have a high school
- 14 diploma.
- 15 (b) A funding recipient shall receive funding according to
- 16 subsection (10) for a participant in a course offered under this
- 17 subsection until 1 of the following occurs:
- 18 (i) The participant passes the course and earns a high school
- 19 diploma.
- 20 (ii) The participant fails to earn credit in 2 successive
- 21 semesters or terms in which the participant is enrolled after
- 22 having completed at least 900 hours of instruction.
- 23 (9) A job or employment-related adult education program
- 24 operated on a year-round or school year basis may be funded under
- 25 this section, subject to all of the following:
- 26 (a) The program enrolls adults referred by their employer who
- 27 are less than 20 years of age, have a high school diploma, are

- 1 determined to be in need of remedial mathematics or communication
- 2 arts skills and are not attending an institution of higher
- 3 education.
- 4 (b) An individual may be enrolled in this program and the
- 5 grant recipient shall receive funding according to subsection (10)
- 6 until 1 of the following occurs:
- 7 (i) The individual achieves the requisite skills as determined
- 8 by appropriate assessment instruments administered at least after
- 9 every 90 hours of attendance.
- 10 (ii) The individual fails to show progress on 2 successive
- 11 assessments after having completed at least 450 hours of
- 12 instruction. The department -of labor and economic growth shall
- 13 provide information to a funding recipient regarding appropriate
- 14 assessment instruments for this program.
- 15 (10) A funding recipient shall receive payments under this
- 16 section in accordance with the following:
- 17 (a) Ninety percent for enrollment of eligible participants.
- 18 (b) Ten percent for completion of the adult basic education
- 19 objectives by achieving an increase of at least 1 grade level of
- 20 proficiency in reading or mathematics; for achieving basic English
- 21 proficiency; for passage of the G.E.D. test; for passage of a
- 22 course required for a participant to attain a high school diploma;
- 23 or for completion of the course and demonstrated proficiency in the
- 24 academic skills to be learned in the course, as applicable.
- 25 (11) As used in this section, "participant" means the sum of
- 26 the number of full-time equated individuals enrolled in and
- 27 attending a department-approved adult education program under this

- 1 section, using quarterly participant count days on the schedule
- 2 described in section 6(7)(b).
- 3 (12) A person who is not eligible to be a participant funded
- 4 under this section may receive adult education services upon the
- 5 payment of tuition. In addition, a person who is not eligible to be
- 6 served in a program under this section due to the program
- 7 limitations specified in subsection (6), (7), (8), or (9) may
- 8 continue to receive adult education services in that program upon
- 9 the payment of tuition. The tuition level shall be determined by
- 10 the local or intermediate district conducting the program.
- 11 (13) An individual who is an inmate in a state correctional
- 12 facility shall not be counted as a participant under this section.
- 13 (14) A district shall not commingle money received under this
- 14 section or from another source for adult education purposes with
- 15 any other funds of the district. A district receiving adult
- 16 education funds shall establish a separate ledger account for those
- 17 funds. This subsection does not prohibit a district from using
- 18 general funds of the district to support an adult education or
- 19 community education program.
- 20 (15) A district or intermediate district receiving funds under
- 21 this section may establish a sliding scale of tuition rates based
- 22 upon a participant's family income. A district or intermediate
- 23 district may charge a participant tuition to receive adult
- 24 education services under this section from that sliding scale of
- 25 tuition rates on a uniform basis. The amount of tuition charged per
- 26 participant shall not exceed the actual operating cost per
- 27 participant minus any funds received under this section per

- 1 participant. A district or intermediate district may not charge a
- 2 participant tuition under this section if the participant's income
- 3 is at or below 200% of the federal poverty guidelines published by
- 4 the United States department of health and human services.
- 5 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act is intended to
- 6 transfer back to the department of education certain powers,
- 7 duties, and functions that were transferred to the former
- 8 department of career development by Executive Reorganization Order
