

SUBSTITUTE FOR
HOUSE BILL NO. 6392
(As amended November 30, 2006)

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled
"Public health code,"
by amending sections 16184 and 16185 (MCL 333.16184 and 333.16185),
section 16184 as added by 2006 PA 24 and section 16185 as added by
2006 PA 25.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 16184. (1) An individual who is retired from the active
- 2 practice of medicine, osteopathic medicine and surgery, —or
- 3 podiatric medicine and surgery, [DENTAL HYGIENE, OPTOMETRY, PSYCHOLOGY,]
OR DENTISTRY and who wishes to
- 4 donate his or her expertise for the medical [, OPTOMETRIC, PSYCHOLOGICAL,]
OR DENTAL care and
- 5 treatment of indigent and needy individuals in this state or for
- 6 the medical [, OPTOMETRIC, PSYCHOLOGICAL,] OR DENTAL care and treatment of
- 7 individuals in
- 8 medically underserved areas of this state may obtain a special
- 9 volunteer license to engage in the practice of medicine,
- 10 osteopathic medicine and surgery, —or— podiatric medicine and

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2 surgery, [DENTAL HYGIENE, OPTOMETRY, PSYCHOLOGY,] OR DENTISTRY by
3 submitting an application to the board

4 pursuant to this section. An application for a special volunteer
5 license shall be on a form provided by the department and shall
6 include each of the following:

7 (a) Documentation that the individual has been previously
8 licensed to engage in the practice of medicine, osteopathic
9 medicine and surgery, —or— podiatric medicine and surgery, [DENTAL
10 HYGIENE, OPTOMETRY, PSYCHOLOGY,] OR
11 DENTISTRY in this state and that his or her license was in good
12 standing prior to the expiration of his or her license.

13 (b) Acknowledgment and documentation that the applicant will
14 not receive any payment or compensation, either direct or indirect,
15 or have the expectation of any payment or compensation, for any
16 medical [, OPTOMETRIC, PSYCHOLOGICAL,] OR DENTAL care services provided
17 under the special
18 volunteer license.

19 (c) If the applicant has been out of practice for 3 or more
20 years, documentation that, during the 3 years immediately preceding
21 the application, he or she has attended at least 2/3 of the
22 continuing education courses or programs required under part 170,
23 175, —or— 180, [174, 182,] OR 166 for the renewal of a license.

24 (2) If the board determines that the application of the
25 individual satisfies the requirements of subsection (1) and that
26 the individual meets the requirements for a license as prescribed
27 by this article and rules promulgated under this article, the board
shall grant a special volunteer license to the applicant. A
licensee seeking renewal under this section shall provide the board
with an updated acknowledgment and documentation as described under
subsection (1) (b). Except as otherwise provided under this

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1 subsection, the board shall not charge a fee for the issuance or
2 renewal of a special volunteer license under this section.

3 (3) Except as otherwise provided under this subsection, an
4 individual who is granted a special volunteer license pursuant to
5 this section and who accepts the privilege of practicing medicine,
6 osteopathic medicine and surgery, —or— podiatric medicine and
7 surgery, [DENTAL HYGIENE, OPTOMETRY, PSYCHOLOGY,] OR DENTISTRY in this
state is subject to all of the
8 provisions of this article, including those provisions concerning
9 continuing education and disciplinary action.

10 (4) For purposes of this section, an individual is considered
11 retired from practice if the individual's license has expired with
12 the individual's intention of ceasing to engage in the practice of
13 medicine, osteopathic medicine and surgery, —or— podiatric medicine
14 and surgery, [DENTAL HYGIENE, OPTOMETRY, PSYCHOLOGY,] OR DENTISTRY for
remuneration.

15 Sec. 16185. (1) Subject to subsection (2), a physician,
16 PODIATRIST, [DENTAL HYGIENIST, OPTOMETRIST, PSYCHOLOGIST,] OR DENTIST who
provides medical care under a special
17 volunteer license granted under section 16184 is not liable in a
18 civil action for personal injury or death proximately caused by the
19 professional negligence or malpractice of the physician,
20 PODIATRIST, [DENTAL HYGIENIST, OPTOMETRIST, PSYCHOLOGIST,] OR DENTIST in
providing the care if both of the
21 following apply:

22 (a) The care is provided at a health facility or agency that
23 provides at least 75% of its care annually to medically indigent
24 individuals.

25 (b) The physician, PODIATRIST, [DENTAL HYGIENIST, OPTOMETRIST,
PSYCHOLOGIST,] OR DENTIST does not receive and
26 does not intend to receive compensation for providing the care.

27 (2) Subsection (1) does not apply if the negligent conduct or

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2 malpractice of the physician, PODIATRIST, [DENTAL HYGIENIST, OPTOMETRIST,
PSYCHOLOGIST,] OR DENTIST is gross

2 negligence.

3 (3) As used in this section:

4 (a) "Gross negligence" means conduct so reckless as to
5 demonstrate a substantial lack of concern for whether an injury
6 results.

7 (b) "Medically indigent individual" means that term as defined
8 in section 106 of the social welfare act, 1939 PA 280, MCL 400.106.
