## SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 435

A bill to amend 1972 PA 382, entitled
"Traxler-McCauley-Law-Bowman bingo act,"
by amending sections 3, 3a, 5, 5c, 8, 10, 10a, and 11b (MCL
432.103, 432.103a, 432.105, 432.105c, 432.108, 432.110, 432.110a,
and 432.111b), section 3 as amended by 1995 PA 275, sections 3a,
5c, and 11b as added and sections 5, 10, and 10a as amended by 1999
PA 108, and section 8 as amended by 1981 PA 229.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 3. (1) "Educational organization" means an organization
- 2 within this state that is organized not for pecuniary profit, whose
- 3 primary purpose is educational in nature and designed to develop
- 4 the capabilities of individuals by instruction in any public or
- 5 private elementary or secondary school that complies with the

- 1 school code of 1976, Act No. 451 of the Public Acts of 1976, being
- 2 sections 380.1 to 380.1852 of the Michigan Compiled Laws REVISED
- 3 SCHOOL CODE, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.1 TO 380.1852, or any private or
- 4 public college or university that is organized not for pecuniary
- 5 profit and that is approved by the state board of education.
- 6 (2) "Fraternal organization" means an organization within this
- 7 state, except a college fraternity or sorority, that is organized
- 8 not for pecuniary profit; that is a branch, lodge, or chapter of a
- 9 national or state organization; and that exists for the common
- 10 purpose, brotherhood, or other interests of its members.
- 11 (3) "Licensee" means a person or qualified organization
- 12 licensed pursuant to UNDER this act.
- 13 (4) "Member" means an individual who qualified for membership
- 14 in a qualified organization pursuant to UNDER its bylaws,
- 15 articles of incorporation, charter, rules, or other written
- 16 statement.
- 17 (5) "Person" means a natural person, firm, association,
- 18 corporation, or other legal entity.
- 19 (6) "Qualified organization" means a bona fide religious,
- 20 educational, service, senior citizens, fraternal, or veterans'
- 21 organization that operates without profit to its members and that
- 22 either has been in existence continuously as an organization for a
- 23 period of 5 years or is exempt from taxation -imposed by the single
- 24 business tax act, Act No. 228 of the Public Acts of 1975, being
- 25 sections 208.1 to 208.145 of the Michigan Compiled Laws UNDER 26
- 26 USC 501(C). Qualified organization does not include a candidate
- 27 committee, political committee, political party committee, ballot

- 1 question committee, independent committee, or any other committee
- 2 as defined by, and organized -pursuant to UNDER, the Michigan
- 3 campaign finance act, Act No. 388 of the Public Acts of 1976,
- 4 being sections 169.201 to 169.282 of the Michigan Compiled Laws
- 5 1976 PA 388, MCL 169.201 TO 169.282.
- 6 (7) "Religious organization" means any of the following:
- 7 (a) An organization, church, body of communicants, or group
- 8 that is organized not for pecuniary profit and that gathers in
- 9 common membership for mutual support and edification in piety,
- 10 worship, and religious observances.
- 11 (b) A society of individuals that is organized not for
- 12 pecuniary profit and that unites for religious purposes at a
- 13 definite place.
- 14 (c) A church related private school that is organized not for
- 15 pecuniary profit.
- 16 (8) "Senior citizens organization" means an organization
- 17 within this state that is organized not for pecuniary profit, that
- 18 consists of at least 15 members who are 60 years of age or older,
- 19 and that exists for their mutual support and for the advancement of
- 20 the causes of elderly or retired persons.
- 21 (9) "Service organization" means either of the following:
- 22 (a) A branch, lodge, or chapter of a national or state
- 23 organization that is organized not for pecuniary profit and that is
- 24 authorized by its written constitution, charter, articles of
- 25 incorporation, or bylaws to engage in a fraternal, civic, or
- 26 service purpose within the state.
- 27 (b) A local civic organization that is organized not for

- 1 pecuniary profit; that is not affiliated with a state or national
- 2 organization; that is recognized by resolution adopted by the local
- 3 governmental subdivision in which the organization conducts its
- 4 principal activities; whose constitution, charter, articles of
- 5 incorporation, or bylaws contain a provision for the perpetuation
- 6 of the organization as a nonprofit organization; whose entire
- 7 assets are <del>pledged to</del> **USED FOR** charitable purposes; and whose
- 8 constitution, charter, articles of incorporation, or bylaws contain
- 9 a provision that all assets, real property, and personal property
- 10 shall revert to the benefit of the local governmental subdivision
- 11 that granted the resolution upon dissolution of the organization.
- 12 (10) "Veterans' organization" means an organization within
- 13 this state, or a branch, lodge, or chapter within this state of a
- 14 state organization or of a national organization chartered by the
- 15 congress of the United States, that is organized not for pecuniary
- 16 profit, the membership of which consists of individuals who were
- 17 members of the armed services or forces of the United States.
- 18 Sec. 3a. (1) "Equipment" means the objects and mechanical or
- 19 electromechanical devices used to determine or assist in
- 20 determining the winners of prizes at events licensed under this
- 21 act.
- 22 (2) "Event" means each occasion of a bingo, millionaire party,
- 23 raffle, charity game, or numeral game licensed under this act.
- 24 (3) "Large bingo" means a series of bingo occasions that occur
- 25 on a regular basis during which the total value of all prizes
- 26 awarded through bingo at a single occasion does not exceed
- \$2,000.00 \$3,500.00 and the total value of all prizes awarded for

- 1 1 game does not exceed \$500.00 \$1,100.00, except that a prize
- 2 awarded through a Michigan progressive jackpot bingo game -shall
- 3 IS not be subject to these limitations.
- 4 (4) "Large raffle" means an event where the total value of all
- 5 prizes awarded through raffle drawings exceed \$500.00 per occasion.
- 6 (5) "Location" means a building, enclosure, part of a building
- 7 or enclosure, or a distinct portion of real estate that is used for
- 8 the purpose of conducting events licensed under this act. Location
- 9 also means all components or buildings that comprise 1
- 10 architectural entity or that serve a unified functional purpose.
- 11 (6) "Manufacturer" means a person licensed under section 11c
- 12 who manufactures numeral game tickets for sale to suppliers for use
- 13 in an event.
- 14 (7) "Michigan progressive jackpot" means a bingo game
- 15 conducted in conjunction with a licensed large bingo occasion,
- 16 where the value of the prize is carried forward to the next bingo
- 17 occasion if no player bingos in a predetermined number of allowable
- 18 calls. Michigan progressive jackpot may include bingo games
- 19 conducted by more than 1 licensee that are linked together for the
- 20 purpose of a common jackpot prize and consolation prize as
- 21 prescribed by the commissioner.
- 22 (8) "Millionaire party" means an event at which wagers are
- 23 placed upon games of chance customarily associated with a gambling
- 24 casino through the use of imitation money or chips that have a
- 25 nominal value equal to or greater than the value of the currency
- 26 for which they can be exchanged.
- 27 (9) "Numeral game" means the random resale of a series of

- 1 numeral game tickets by a qualified organization under a numeral
- 2 game license or in conjunction with a licensed millionaire party or
- 3 large raffle.
- 4 (10) "Numeral game ticket" means a paper strip on which
- 5 preprinted numerals are covered by folding the strip and banding
- 6 the folded strip with a separate piece of paper, if upon breaking
- 7 the paper strip that bands the ticket, the purchaser discovers
- 8 whether the ticket is a winning ticket and the purchaser may be
- 9 awarded a merchandise prize.
- 10 (11) "Occasion" means the hours of the day for which a license
- 11 is issued.
- 12 (12) "Principal officer" means the highest ranking officer of
- 13 the qualified organization according to its written constitution,
- 14 charter, articles of incorporation, or bylaws.
- 15 (13) "Prize" means anything of value, including, but not
- 16 limited to, money or merchandise that is given to a player for
- 17 attending or winning a game at an event. A nonmonetary item is
- 18 valued at its retail value. PRIZE DOES NOT INCLUDE ADVERTISING
- 19 MATERIAL GIVEN AWAY BY A QUALIFIED ORGANIZATION IN ACCORDANCE WITH
- 20 RULES PROMULGATED UNDER THIS ACT.
- 21 (14) "Single gathering" means 1 scheduled assembly or meeting
- 22 with a specified beginning and ending time that is conducted or
- 23 sponsored by the qualified organization. Single gathering does not
- 24 include the regular operating hours of a club or similar facility
- 25 and does not include a meeting conducted solely for the purpose of
- 26 conducting a raffle.
- 27 (15) "Small bingo" means a series of bingo occasions that

- 1 occur on a regular basis during which the total value of all prizes
- 2 awarded through bingo at a single occasion does not exceed \$300.00
- 3 and the total value of all prizes awarded for a single bingo game
- 4 does not exceed \$25.00.
- 5 (16) "Small raffle" means an event during which the total
- 6 value of all prizes awarded through raffle drawings does not exceed
- 7 \$500.00 during 1 occasion.
- 8 (17) "Special bingo" means a single or consecutive series of
- 9 bingo occasions during which the total value of all prizes awarded
- 10 through bingo at a single occasion does not exceed \$2,000.00
- 11 \$3,500.00 and the total value of all prizes awarded for a single
- 12 bingo game does not exceed \$500.00 \$1,100.00.
- 13 (18) "Supplier" means a person licensed under this act to
- 14 rent, sell, or lease equipment or to sell charity game or numeral
- 15 game tickets to qualified organizations licensed under this act.
- Sec. 5. (1) A large or small bingo license may be reissued
- 17 annually upon the submitting of an application for renewal provided
- 18 by the commissioner and upon the licensee's payment of the
- 19 appropriate fee. A small or large bingo license expires at 12
- 20 midnight on the last day of February.
- 21 (2) A qualified organization may hold more than 1 bingo
- 22 license.
- 23 (3) A small or large bingo license shall be valid for not more
- 24 than 1 day per week.
- 25 (4) Not more than 10 bingo licenses shall be issued for a 7-
- 26 day period at any 1 location.
- 27 (5) Not more than 1 bingo license shall be issued to a

- 1 qualified organization for any 1 day.
- 2 (6) Not more than 2 bingo licenses shall be issued for the
- 3 same day at any 1 location.
- 4 (5) -(7) A special bingo license may be issued for up to 7
- 5 consecutive days.
- 6 (6) -(8) A qualified organization may be issued up to 4
- 7 special bingo licenses per calendar year.
- 8 Sec. 5c. (1) The value of a prize or consolation prize awarded
- 9 during a Michigan progressive jackpot bingo game is not subject to
- 10 the prize limitations of section 3a(3).
- 11 (2) The prize awarded to the winner of a Michigan progressive
- 12 jackpot bingo game may be a predetermined amount that shall not
- 13 exceed \$500.00 OR 50% OF THE CARD SALES on the first bingo
- 14 occasion.
- 15 (3) If a Michigan progressive jackpot prize is not won in the
- 16 predetermined number of allowable calls, the game shall be played
- 17 to its conclusion for a predetermined consolation prize that shall
- 18 not exceed \$100.00.
- 19 (4) If a Michigan progressive jackpot prize is not won in the
- 20 predetermined number of allowable calls, the entire prize amount
- 21 shall be carried forward to the next scheduled bingo occasion.
- 22 (5) When a Michigan progressive jackpot prize has been carried
- 23 forward from a previous bingo occasion, the new prize amount shall
- 24 include the entire amount carried forward, plus 50% of the card
- 25 sales for the Michigan progressive jackpot bingo game for the
- 26 current bingo occasion.
- 27 (6) No arrangement of numbers other than a coverall pattern

- 1 shall be required or allowed to win a Michigan progressive jackpot
- 2 bingo game.
- 3 (7) A Michigan progressive jackpot bingo game shall be played
- 4 only on bingo cards that are approved by the commissioner.
- 5 (8) All cards for the Michigan progressive jackpot bingo game
- 6 shall be sold by the licensee at a uniform price with no discount
- 7 for the purchase of more than 1 card.
- 8 (9) All bingo cards used in the Michigan progressive jackpot
- 9 bingo game shall be sold prior to the drawing of the first ball for
- 10 that game.
- 11 (9) (10)— Whenever a Michigan progressive jackpot bingo game
- 12 is conducted, the licensee shall post a notice and announce the
- 13 following information:
- 14 (a) The maximum number of allowable calls in which the player
- 15 must complete a coverall pattern in order to win a Michigan
- 16 progressive jackpot prize on that occasion.
- 17 (b) The prize amount offered to the winner of the Michigan
- 18 progressive jackpot game and the consolation prize for that bingo
- 19 occasion.
- 20 (c) The date the next bingo occasion will occur in that
- 21 particular progression if the jackpot is not awarded.
- 22 (10) —(11)— A Michigan progressive jackpot bingo game shall be
- 23 conducted in the following manner:
- 24 (a) On the first bingo occasion a player shall not be required
- 25 to obtain bingo in less than -50 numbers called THE NUMBER OF
- 26 ALLOWABLE CALLS AS PRESCRIBED BY THE COMMISSIONER to win the
- 27 jackpot prize.

- 1 (b) The number of allowable calls required to win the jackpot
- 2 shall be increased by 1 number on each successive bingo occasion
- 3 FOR THAT LICENSEE in a particular progression.
- 4 (c) Once a Michigan progressive jackpot bingo game has been
- 5 started, the progressive jackpot prize shall be offered at each
- 6 successive bingo occasion for that licensee until the jackpot prize
- 7 has been won.
- 8 (d) A Michigan progressive jackpot progression shall only be
- 9 terminated or interrupted by 1 of the following:
- 10 (i) Determining a winner of the Michigan progressive jackpot
- 11 prize.
- 12 (ii) Expiration, suspension, revocation, or surrender of the
- 13 license to conduct bingo.
- 14 (iii) A previously announced scheduled interruption, such as a
- 15 legal holiday or other temporary closing.
- 16 (iv) A valid emergency condition under which the licensee is
- 17 unable to conduct the game.
- 18 (11) -(12) Only 1 Michigan progressive jackpot bingo game
- 19 shall be in progress at 1 time per bingo occasion.
- 20 (12) (13)— Prizes for a Michigan progressive jackpot bingo
- 21 game shall be awarded as follows:
- 22 (a) The Michigan progressive jackpot prize shall be awarded to
- 23 the player or players who complete the coverall pattern within the
- 24 predesignated number of allowable calls.
- 25 (b) A consolation prize shall be awarded on each bingo
- 26 occasion at which a Michigan progressive jackpot game is played,
- 27 except on the bingo occasion that the jackpot prize is won.

- 1 (c) The consolation prize shall be awarded to the player or
- 2 players who complete a coverall pattern on each bingo occasion,
- 3 regardless of the number of calls in excess of the predesignated
- 4 number of allowable calls required to win the Michigan progressive
- 5 jackpot bingo game.
- 6 (13)  $\frac{(14)}{(14)}$  The jackpot prize shall be awarded by a check
- 7 written from the licensee's financial account OR IN THE MANNER
- 8 PRESCRIBED BY THE COMMISSIONER.
- 9 (14)  $\frac{(15)}{(15)}$  Except as otherwise provided in this section, all
- 10 other provisions of this act or rules promulgated under this act
- 11 apply to the conduct of a Michigan progressive jackpot game.
- 12 (15)  $\frac{(16)}{}$  If an organization's bingo license will expire or
- is suspended, revoked, or surrendered before the last bingo
- 14 occasion of a particular progression, the jackpot prize shall be
- 15 awarded and the winner determined on the last authorized bingo
- 16 occasion regardless of the number of calls required to determine
- 17 the winner.
- 18 Sec. 8. All fees and revenue collected by the commissioner or
- 19 bureau under this act shall be paid into the state lottery fund.
- 20 All necessary expenses incurred by the bureau in the administration
- 21 and enforcement of ANY ACTIVITY AUTHORIZED BY this act and in the
- 22 initiation, implementation, and ongoing operation of -charity games
- 23 ANY ACTIVITY AUTHORIZED BY THIS ACT shall be financed from the
- 24 state lottery fund. The amount of these necessary expenses shall
- 25 not exceed the amount of revenues received from the sale of charity
- 26 game tickets and all fees collected under this act. -, except that
- 27 this limitation shall not apply before October 1, 1983. At the end

- 1 of each fiscal year all money, including interest, in the state
- 2 lottery fund which is attributable to fees and revenue collected
- 3 pursuant to UNDER this act but which has not been expended
- 4 pursuant to UNDER this section shall be deposited in the state
- 5 general fund.
- 6 Sec. 10. (1) Only a member of the qualified organization shall
- 7 participate in the management of an event.
- 8 (2) A person shall not receive any commission, salary, pay,
- 9 profit, or wage for participating in the management or operation of
- 10 bingo, a millionaire party, A RAFFLE, or a charity game except as
- 11 provided by rule promulgated under this act.
- 12 (3) Except by special permission of the commissioner, a
- 13 licensee shall conduct bingo or a millionaire party only with
- 14 equipment that it owns, uses under a bureau-approved rental
- 15 contract, or is purchasing or renting at a reasonable rate from a
- 16 supplier.
- 17 (4) A licensee shall not advertise bingo except to the extent
- 18 and in the manner permitted by rule promulgated under this act. If
- 19 the commissioner permits a licensee to advertise bingo, the
- 20 licensee shall indicate in the advertisement the purposes for which
- 21 the net proceeds will be used by the licensee.
- 22 (5) The holder of a millionaire party license shall not
- 23 advertise the event, except to the extent and in the manner
- 24 permitted by rule promulgated under this act. If the commissioner
- 25 permits a licensee to advertise the event, the licensee shall
- 26 indicate in the advertising the purposes for which the net proceeds
- 27 will be used by the licensee. -, and shall give notice of the

- 1 \$500.00 personal limitation on winnings required by section 10a(e).
- 2 Sec. 10a. All of the following apply in the conduct of a
- 3 millionaire party:
- 4 (a) A person less than 18 years of age shall not be permitted
- 5 to wager.
- 6 (b) A wager may not be placed on a contest other than a game
- 7 of chance taking place at the location and during the time period
- 8 approved for the event, and in no event shall a wager be placed
- 9 upon an athletic event or upon a game involving personal skill.
- 10 (c) The licensee under the millionaire party license shall be
- 11 responsible for insuring that the requirements of this section are
- **12** met.
- 13 (d) A qualified organization shall not receive more than
- 14 \$15,000.00 in exchange for imitation money or chips in 1 day of a
- 15 millionaire party.
- 16 (e) A person participating in a millionaire party shall not be
- 17 awarded prizes having an aggregate value greater than \$500.00 per
- 18 day. The value of raffle, charity game, and numeral game prizes
- 19 awarded at the millionaire party is not subject to the limitations
- 20 of this section. A notice of personal limitation on winnings shall
- 21 be given to the participant or posted at the location of the event.
- Sec. 11b. (1) Each applicant for a license or renewal of a
- 23 license to operate as a supplier of equipment, charity game
- 24 tickets, or numeral game tickets to qualified organizations
- 25 licensed under this act shall submit a written application to the
- 26 bureau on a form prescribed by the commissioner.
- 27 (2) The applicant shall pay an annual license fee of \$300.00

- 1 at the time of the application.
- 2 (3) A supplier's license expires at 12 midnight on September
- 3 0 of each year.
- 4 (4) The commissioner shall require suppliers authorized to
- 5 sell charity game tickets, numeral game tickets, or both, to post a
- 6 performance bond of not less than \$50,000.00 and not greater than
- $7 \quad \frac{$500,000.00}{} $1,000,000.00$ .
- **8** (5) A supplier shall remit to the bureau an amount equal to
- 9 the qualified organization's purchase price of the charity game
- 10 tickets less an amount that shall not be less than the sum of \$.008
- 11 for each ticket sold plus 1.0% of the total resale value for all
- 12 charity game tickets sold.
- 13 (6) For each numeral game sold, the supplier shall issue to
- 14 the licensed organization an invoice listing the manufacturer and
- 15 serial number of each game.
- 16 (7) The fee collected by a supplier from the qualified
- 17 organization for each game of numeral tickets sold shall be \$5.00
- 18 per 1,000 tickets or any portion of 1,000 tickets.
- 19 (8) The fees collected by the supplier for each numeral game
- 20 sold shall be remitted to the bureau by the fifteenth day of the
- 21 month following the month in which the numeral game is sold. A late
- 22 fee of 25% of the amount due may be assessed by the commissioner
- 23 against any supplier who fails to remit the fees by the required
- 24 filing date.
- 25 (9) A supplier shall only display, offer for sale, sell, or
- 26 otherwise make available to a qualified organization numeral game
- 27 tickets that have been obtained from a manufacturer.

- 1 (10) A person who is directly or indirectly connected to the
- 2 sale, rental, or distribution of bingo or millionaire party
- 3 equipment, or the sale of charity game tickets or numeral game
- 4 tickets, or a person residing in the same household as the supplier
- 5 shall not be involved directly or indirectly with the rental or
- 6 leasing of a facility used for an event.
- 7 (11) A supplier shall submit to the bureau a report as
- 8 required by the commissioner regarding the sale or rental of
- 9 equipment and the sale of charity game tickets and numeral game
- 10 tickets.
